**LIFE IN THE SPIRIT SEMINAR (SESSIONS 6 & 7):** Those of you who attended the Life in the Spirit Seminar last weekend are invited to come to St. Michael Church on Monday, April 27 at 7:00 pm – 9:00 pm for the topics of Growth and Transformation in Christ. It will give you an opportunity to share your experience of being Baptized in the Holy Spirit and to be open to opportunities for growth at North American Martyrs Parish.

Several of you commented that you have enjoyed reading it and are learning a lot more about the New Evangelization. Since our parish is one of those in which The Joy of the Gospel has been distributed, **Dr. Michel Therrien**, the Secretary for Evangelization and Catholic Education of the Diocese of Pittsburgh would like to come to speak at DeLuca Hall on Monday, May 4 from 6:30 pm to 9:00 pm on “Pope Francis’ Vision for the New Evangelization”. This is free and open to the public. It would be helpful to have completed reading The Joy of the Gospel before coming to this seminar but it is not necessary. Whomever attends will come away with having learned more about what the Holy Father expects of us regarding “The New Evangelization”.

**IMMIGRATION SPEAKER:** Mrs. Helene Paharik is an Associate General Secretary of the Diocese of Pittsburgh. She is married to James Paharik who is a Professor of Sociology at Seton Hill University. Together they have travelled to the Mid-East whose culture Jim has studied extensively. Helene will be speaking on the United States Bishops’ view of the Immigration crisis in America as part of the Infant Jesus Respect Life meeting on Tuesday, May 5, at St. Michael Church at 7:45 pm (immediately after the 7:00 pm St. Anthony Novena Mass). **Called & Gifted** The *Called & Gifted™ Discernment Process* is a program from the Catherine of Siena Institute, Colorado Springs, Colorado, and has been used since 1993 by over 75,000 lay, ordained, and religious Catholics and other Christians around the world. The *Called & Gifted™* process is designed to help Christians discern the presence of *charisms* in their life. The cost will be \$30.00. Two speakers are flying in from across the country to present this valuable workshop.**

**THE CALLED & GIFTED™** is a three part discernment process intended to help lay Catholics discern their charisms. All three parts of the process are necessary to determine where you are gifted. Part one is the Called and Gifted workshop, this workshop lays the foundation for the *beginning* of discernment. Part two is the One Hour Gifts interview, this is an invaluable part of the process. Part three, the *substance* of the discernment process. These final steps will teach you how to develop charism experiments and how to evaluate your results. The last part of this process will teach you how to identify ways you learned to control life as a child that get in the way of using your charisms as an adult.

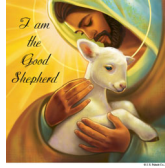
