EXTRAORDINARY EXPENSES COLLECTION: I would like to thank **Tim Thorsen, Donna Balcik** and **Joe Kowalczyk** as members of our Parish Finance Council for speaking at each Mass this past weekend to make an appeal for our Extraordinary Expenses collection. So far, we have collected \$2,359 from the second collection last weekend (along with On Line Giving). In addition, a parishioner gave us an anonymous donation of \$5,000. Our total thus far is \$7,359 to help whittle away the deficit that we have been carrying from our Offerory Collections. HOSPITAL VISITATION: Toward the end of April, Forbes Regional Hospital began a new hospital-wide computer system called "Epic". This means that all the doctors, nurses, and care givers (including Pastoral Care) are now using this system. In terms of the daily hospital census of patients, "Epic"

is more complete than the former computer software in giving the age, sex, religious affiliation, length of stay and whether the patient was anointed or declined being anointed. A most important feature that "Epic" does not include is Church Affiliation. Formerly, the software program would identify which church each patient was from. This new computer software does not do that at this time. **Chaplain Wargo** left a note for us ministers that they are trying to address this problem so that "Epic" will identify each patient according to church affiliation. In the meantime, there may be 40 Catholic patients at Forbes Hospital on any given day. It is very tedious and time consuming to scan the list by phone, as I have done, with the help of Charlotte or Pat, to see if we recognize any of these names as being members of our parish. It would be most helpful, if you as a family member or friend would call and tell Charlotte or Pat if any our parishioners are at Forbes Regional Hospital so that Fr. Steve or I may visit them and offer the sacraments.

SCHOOL RENOVATION: I received permission from the **Diocesan General Secretary, Fr. Larry DiNardo**, to hire architect **Luke Desmone** to begin the process of drawing blueprints and distributing to contractors to get a bid on the School Renovation Project. I am still awaiting permission from Fr. DiNardo for the architect to design the Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration Chapel which an outside donor wishes to pay for.

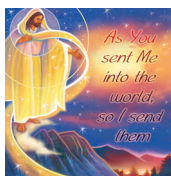
