***PRIESTHOOD, QUO VADIS DAYS, PRINCIPAL SELECTED,  
POVERTY SIMULATION EXERCISE, FOURTH OF JULY PARADE***



**PRIESTHOOD:** I am planning on attending the Priesthood Ordination of the six men to be ordained priests for the Diocese of Pittsburgh on Saturday, June 27. This is the largest class of men to be ordained priests in our diocese since 1994 when there were six men ordained. I was part of a class of twelve men ordained in 1983. Fr. Steve was part of a class of twelve men ordained in 1960. We are delighted that six men will be joining the ranks of the fraternity of priests. At the same time, we are all aware that this number does not begin to make up for the number of priests who are either: retiring, dying or taking leaves of absence. Here are some sobering statistics: There are 200 parishes in the Diocese of Pittsburgh and there are 234 priests active in the diocese. Thirty-seven of these priests are over 70 years old. We have 99 deacons in our diocese. Within 10 years, 124 priests will be over age 70.

As the shortage of priests becomes more acute over time, we need to redouble our prayers for more religious vocations. Jesus said to his disciples, “The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest.” (Matt. 9:37)

**QUO VADIS DAYS:** The words, “Quo Vadis” is Latin for “Where are you going?” This was asked by the apostles of Jesus, to which he replied, “Come and see.” This is a four-day camp on July 12-15, 2015 at the Bishop Connare Center in Greensburg where young men entering/in/or just graduating from high school get the opportunity to come together for prayer, tons of fun, and solid brotherhood. The basic structure of QVD is prayer/talks/discussion in the morning and games (indoor and outdoor) in the afternoons. In the evenings, there will be cookouts, some more time for prayer, and then more games. The point is to create a fun environment where the young men who come can have a chance to meet a bunch of different priests and seminarians, learn to pray the Liturgy of the Hours, and begin to be comfortable asking the question about a priestly vocation. It’s been an incredible tool for increasing interest in vocations to the priesthood in Harrisburg, Arlington, (VA), DC and a lot of other dioceses across the country. Please pray for the success of Quo Vadis Days and ask a young man you know to consider attending this four-day camp. You never know . . . one day he could become a priest! **PRINCIPAL SELECTED:** On Monday, June 22, my search committee and I interviewed three candidates for the position of principal at North American Martyrs School. The consensus of the six member committee was for me to hire one of the candidates who interviewed. I prayed before the Blessed Sacrament and agreed with the recommendation of the search committee. I offered the position to one of these candidates and this candidate accepted. I cannot name this candidate until **Bishop Zubik** and the Diocesan Legal Office approve of my decision to hire this candidate. Once approved, I will sign the contract with him/her and he/she will begin working on July 1<sup>st</sup>. This candidate has agreed to speak at all of the Masses next weekend (July 4/5) so that you will have a chance to meet him/her. This candidate has also agreed to work at our Parish Festival. I think that you will be very impressed. Thank you for your prayers.

**POVERTY SIMULATION EXERCISE:** **Elizabeth Trexler**, myself and other members of our parish will take part in a Poverty Simulation Exercise at the Monroeville Convention Center on June 30, from 6:00 pm to 8:30 pm. This exercise, sponsored by the Monroeville Interfaith Ministerium, has been conducted in other communities with rave reviews. It is a role play situation in which the participants are assigned certain identities, assigned a limited budget, assigned with bills, so that each participant can feel what it’s really like to be poor. The effect is for all the participants to develop better strategies to help the materially poor in our community. Elizabeth and I are looking forward to this exercise. Much fruit will be born from it, I’m sure.

**FOURTH OF JULY PARADE:** Every year our school constructs a float to be in the Monroeville Fourth of July Parade. Often times the float is a prize winner! Regardless of whether our school wins a prize or not, it is an opportunity to get to know the people along the parade route to promote our school. If you are sitting in a lawn chair watching the parade, look for us!

All participants will need to get sponsors for the famine. For every \$400 we raise as a group, a child is fed, clothed, and supplied with school materials for 1 year. 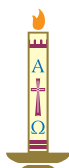
