## A FINE TRADITION . . .



Fr. Steve and I were guests of **Rollo Vecchio** and **Patsy Pizzuto** on Wednesday evening, July 29<sup>th</sup> as we visited Pitcairn Camp B. I had heard much about it in my nearly six years here and wanted to see it for myself and Rollo and Patsy gladly took us along. Both Fr. Steve and I were very impressed! We travelled to Laurel Hill State Park which is a few miles past Seven Springs Resort. We were told that vandals had done much damage to the camp where Camp B has always been and that this was the first year at this new campsite. The staff and campers adapted very well! There were 100 boys ranging in age from 7 to 16. There were also about 30 men. It didn't take long to see how organized the camp was. We arrived in time for dinner at the Mess Hall. We were warmly greeted and applauded by all. It was "Chinese night" as we dined on General Tso's chicken and egg rolls along with ice tea and snacks. It was quite tasty. We were then given official Camp B tee shirts. Then Fr. Steve and I were given a guided tour by parishioners **Mike Castagnero** and **Marty Galia**. We walked down to the lake which was lined with upside down canoes on the beach in the ready position. We watched boys from two different cabins challenge each other in a game of beach volleyball—complete with sand! Beyond our view, other boys were swimming in a cordoned section of the water. Always there were adults on hand to supervise. It turns out that when a boy turns 16, he can be on Junior Staff and they get their own cabin. For those 17-21 they can be part of Senior Staff with the other men. There were several Junior Staff and Senior Staff young men to assist with the games and activities. You can tell they were having fun with the boys. On a rotating schedule, the boys in each cabin would compete with each other earning points from every whiffle ball game, kickball game, volleyball game and other activities including cabin inspection.

While not specifically a Christian camp, there was always grace before meals and taps at night as the American flag would be lowered for the "taking down of the colors." I learned that Pitcairn Camp B was founded after World War II, in 1946, by **Irvin "Irv" Baltzerson** who may have been a Scoutmaster and borrowed many of the activities from Scouts for boys who could not afford to be in Scouting. So says, **Carl Howard** of the Pitcairn Historical Society who verified the spelling of Mr. Baltzerson's name. The boys couldn't pronounce his name so they called him "Mr. B". That's where Camp B comes from. Unfortunately, Mr. B suffered an untimely and tragic death in an ambulance accident. Coincidentally, the "B" also stands for boys as there is a Camp G which stands for girls. Camp G began in the 60's and I learned that this year, there will be about 60 girls along with many adult women, going to Camp Jumonville for their camping experience.

What was so refreshing to see (and uncommon) at Camp B was the "male bonding" that we witnessed with such a variety of activities including: Carnival night with inflatables (the favorite of which was "Wrecking Ball") carnival games like bean toss, a dunking booth, basketball shoot, a balancing game along with music playing and the omnipresent ping pong tables, checkers and chess boards. There were snow cones and popcorn given out in the Rec Center where boys could have done spin art, had been given wash off tattoos, been given balloon hats, or had their faces painted. "Buffo" the clown known as "the strongest clown around" made his annual appearance at the Rec Hall. This was topped off by a variety of home-made pizza with dough donated by Fox Pizza and heated in the convection oven on hand. As a college student on staff, **Will Kuster**, told me "The boys don't get bored, they get tired."

From talking to several of the staff I learned that they attended Camp B when they were six or seven years old and have been coming ever since. Many of these men take off a week's vacation just to "give back" to the boys. There was a lot of pride in these men whose hard work and commitment assures the perpetuity of this fine tradition which this year marks **69 consecutive years** of operation. The boys came from the Gateway, Penn Trafford and Norwin School Districts. I am not aware of any community in Southwestern Pennsylvania by which youths could have so much fun sponsored by volunteers many of whom are "life members" of Camp B and have their own board. It costs each boy \$150.00 for a week-long camp experience to create for most of them, their most memorable summer experience. Some men sponsor the boys in addition to having a very successful annual golf outing and Night at the Races to raise a total of an aggregate amount of \$25,000. One woman named **Dolores** whom I met with a woman named **Teddy** (who were the only two women there other than the balloon lady) donated a total of \$8,000.00 from her Family Foundation to make this dream possible for these boys. Steve and I were very inspired by what we experienced. Camp B (and Camp G) are treasures of our region and a legacy that continues for future generations. It's something that we can all be proud of.
