FLEA MARKET THANK YOU: Thanks to **Keven & Patty Toohill (and Jack & Katy Jean)** for their family being responsible for the NAM School Flea Market again this year. Thankfully, the total was \$14,380.00 which was close to last year's total. Thanks to all those who volunteered at the Flea Market as well as those who donated items and bought items. As in former years, **Fr. Tom Lewandowski** has agreed to bring what was left over from the flea market in his tractor trailer to those who are poor who live in Appalachia.

FEAST OF THE ASSUMPTION: This year, the Feast of the Assumption, August 15, falls on a Saturday **so this year it is not a Holy Day of Obligation**. It is still a holy day, honoring Mary. When Fr. Steve celebrates the 9:00 am Mass on Saturday, August 15, he will be using the Mass prayers and readings for the Assumption of the Blessed Mother into heaven. The confusing part goes back several years ago when the United States Bishops Conference voted that **certain** holy days of obligation such as the Feast of the Assumption, All Saints Day and, Mary, the Mother of God (January 1) may **not be a holy day of obligation** (but still a holy day) **if that day happens to fall on a Saturday or a Monday**. The thinking was that it would be too hard for people to attend this Mass when it falls at the beginning or end of the week. With the Feast of the Ascension of the Lord, some bishops (like those in the Northeast) chose to keep it on the 40th day after Easter, i.e. Ascension Thursday. Bishops of the West and Midwest chose to celebrate it on a Sunday that is approximately 40 days after Easter. The other two Holy Days of Obligation are permanent which includes: Christmas (which is always a Holy Day of Obligation) and the Feast of the Immaculate Conception (Dec. 8) which is always a Holy Day of Obligation since this is the patronal feast of the Americas.

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION DAY: Our regular monthly **Eucharistic Adoration Day is Monday, August 10**. The Eucharist will be exposed after the 8:00 am Mass so that you can adore Jesus all day. I will be offering a Holy Hour at 7:00 pm on Monday, August 10.

FESTIVAL OF PRAISE: **Bishop Zubik** will be offering a **Festival of Praise on Wednesday, August 12 at St. Paul Cathedral, Oakland at 7:00 pm**. This is a time when the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed along with sacred music to lead the congregation in praise. The Bishop will be reflecting to the congregation on the Scripture reading that he selects.

HEALING MASS On the same day as the Festival of Praise will be the **Fraternity of Priests Healing Mass at St. Francis of Assisi Church, Finleyville at 7:00 pm**. Since I am a member of the Fraternity of Priests I will be attending the Healing Mass. Feel free to attend the Festival of Praise at the Cathedral or the Healing Mass in Finleyville as you wish. Many graces will be bestowed on all those who attend either event.

MISSION COOP VISIT

mission Next weekend, we will welcome Bishop Vincent Mar Paulos, the Bishop of the Diocese of Marthandam, located in Tamil Nadu, India. The total population in that diocese is two million people including 75,000 new converts. The Diocese constructs mission Chapels & Churches that will serve for liturgical celebrations and Holy Masses as well as places where catechism lessons, Bible study, and social gatherings will take place. At present there are 52 priests for 85 churches/mission stations in the Diocese. Each priest has two or three parishes under his pastoral care. They are responsible for various needs in their parishioners' lives such as education, social, family, economic development, etc. The Diocese struggles to provide the basic needs such as salary, medical insurance, transportation, food and accommodation of these priests. In spite of the lack of infrastructure, the Diocese has started a Minor Seminary to give basic formation to 55 seminarians studying for priesthood. It costs \$60.00 per month to support a seminarian. Watch this space next week for more information about this Mission. There is a Mission Coop envelope in your packets.
