**PITCAIRN ROAD OPEN, BUS TRIP TO PHILADELPHIA, PRAYER MEETING, HEALING MASS,
FRUITS OF THE MYSTERIES OF THE ROSARY**



PITCAIRN ROAD OPEN: After two years, Pitcairn Road is opened again! Back in July of 2013, after heavy rain, there was a hillside collapse in two places along Pitcairn Road. There was a long process of the Allegheny County Road Department checking with home owners to ask them to buy their land or for permission to put heavy equipment on their land in order to do core borings, soil sample testing etc. As we know, one section of Pitcairn Road was completed several months ago. The second section was held up for lack of funds. I had spoken to the Project Manager last year who told me that there were several projects throughout Allegheny County and the money would only go so far. I had also spoken with Monroeville **Mayor Erosenko** last year who shared my concerns particularly for police, firemen and emergency vehicles being able to reach people who lived along that route. Finally, the project is completed allowing a short cut between our two churches as I used during my first four years here. Interestingly, Pastoral Associate **Elizabeth Trexler** and **Fr. Steve Chervenak** have never driven on that section of Pitcairn Road since both of them came to our parish after the road closure of July 2013. One of the added features of Pitcairn Road re-opening is that now one can access Pitcairn Road via Center Ave to Stroschein Road.

BUS TRIP TO PHILADELPHIA: Currently we still have a few more openings on the bus trip to Philadelphia for the World Meeting of Families and the Pope's visit. We will leave at 7:00 am on Thursday, September 24 and return late in the evening on Sunday, September 27. It promises to be a memorable trip! The cost for a room (three nights) is \$627.00. (The room cost could be split between two people and this cost also includes a hot breakfast.) This is your last opportunity to join us for this trip since the deadline is soon approaching.

This weekend, we welcome Bishop Vincent Mar Paulos, the Bishop of the Diocese of Marthandam, located in Tamil Nadu, India. Through the “Marthandam Integrated Development Society”, the Diocese tries to help many people who are economically, socially and educationally backward. Programs include ‘Save A Family Plan’, ‘Small Scale Industries’, Job-oriented training programs, constructing small houses for the extremely poor, scholarship programs to help students to continue their education, and Health for One Million, a program devised to provide basic health care to the poorest of the poor. Most recently, a special program in the social work center was launched by giving milk-cows to 200 families. It provides a small but daily income, and thus is a great help for the families that struggle for even their daily bread. “Shalom Home” is another initiative to take care of the terminally ill people who are abandoned by all. The Diocese supports five orphanages (housing almost 500 children), two houses for the aged, two small rural clinics/hospitals, and a leprosy rehabilitation center. Elementary schools run by the Diocese in the remote areas cater to the educational needs of poor village children. As the people cannot support themselves, they cannot be expected to support those who serve them – priests, nuns and social workers – for which the Diocese of Marthandam depends on others of good will.
