LAY ECCLESIAL MINISTER: Bishop Zubik would like each of our full-time professional lay staff to consider becoming certified as a Lay Ecclesial Minister. **Donna Lew-Buechel**, our Director of Religious Education was our only Lay Ecclesial Minister until **Elizabeth Trexler**, Pastoral Associate, recently completed her certification. Congratulations Elizabeth! Other Lay Ecclesial Ministers in the Diocese of Pittsburgh include: College Campus Minister, Director of Music Ministries, Elementary School Principal, Parish Business Manager, Parish Social Minister, Pastoral Health Care Minister, Secondary School Principal and Youth Minister.

The second annual Mass of Commissioning and Authorization for Lay Ecclesial Ministers will be celebrated on Sunday, November 8, 2015 at 2:30 p.m., in St. Paul Cathedral. Thirteen is the most we've ever had from our parish at our Forty Days for Life Prayer Vigil! Thanks to all of you who prayed at home or at work. We don't know whether we saved any babies or not. However, one of the pregnant women we met was homeless and was counseled by **Vicky Pernick**. Vicky persisted and through the grace of God was able to find a temporary place for the woman to stay. Being pro-life often means more than just praying to save babies. We are also concerned about the mother's safety and well-being. Please pray for this woman and let's continue to do our part to respect life from conception to natural death.

MONTH OF THE ROSARY

October is designated as the Month of the Rosary, and the Rosary is usually recited in our church after the morning Masses. NEIGHBORHOOD 4, ST. JEAN DE BREBEUF

St. John de Brebeuf was one of the first Jesuit missionaries to reach Canada. He was a hardy frontiersman and established the first mission in 1625 near Lake Ontario. He was the first of the martyrs to be killed while preaching Christianity. In 1649, the Iroquois captured the Huron village of Saint Ignatius and he was killed. His courage was admired by the young native Americans. The feast of the North American Martyrs is Monday, October 19! NEIGHBORHOOD 5, ST. CHARLES GARNIER

St. Charles Garnier arrived in Canada in 1636. He, like the other martyrs, preached the faith to the Native Americans. He did much of his work in the Ossernenon village. In 1649, while working with a group of followers, he was killed by the Iroquois. Join us to celebrate the Feast of the North American Martyrs at the wine and cheese social after the 4:00 PM mass on Saturday, October 17.

NEIGHBORHOOD 6, ST. GABRIEL LALAMANT

St. Gabriel Lalemant arrived in 1648 at Fort St. Mary in Canada. In 1649 he joined Fr. Brebeuf at St. Ignatius. They worked at the mission there attempting to convert the Native Americans to Christianity. The mission was captured by the Iroquois tribe and he was taken prisoner and killed. NEIGHBORHOOD 7, ST. ANTOINE DANIEL

St. Antoine Daniel came to see and stay in Canada in 1632. He preached Christianity to the Native Americans and started the school of our Lady of Angels in Quebec for Native American boys. Many of the Native Americans disliked the idea of their young boys being taught Christianity and the idea of a peaceful existence. One day in 1648 while he was saying mass in his frontier chapel he was killed.

NEIGHBORHOOD 8, ST. NOEL CHABANEL

St. Noel Chabanel came to Canada in 1643. He worked for 6 years among the Algonquin near Fort St. Mary. He disliked the cruel customs and tried to teach and show the Native Americans the Christian way. In 1649, he was killed out of hatred for the faith he was teaching to the Huron Indians.
