**NEW PARISH MUSIC MINISTER, THE INNOCENTS, LAY ECCLESIAL MINISTER, PRAYER MTG.**

**NEW PARISH MUSIC MINISTER:** I am happy to announce that Mr. Paul White is our new part-time Parish Music Minister effective October 28, 2015 (contingent upon final approval with the Diocese of Pittsburgh). Paul is proficient both in organ and piano and has a fine voice. Paul earned a B.A. in Music with a major in Music Education from Westminster College in 1980. His major instrument was piano. I have known Paul for many years going back to when I was parochial vicar at St. Wendelin Parish, Carrick, where Paul was the parish music minister. Paul had been the parish music minister at St. Wendelin Church from March of 1991 to June of 2014. When St. Wendelin Parish was combined with St. Basil Parish on June of 2014, Paul continued as the Music Minister for both parishes until June of 2015. Paul also has been employed at the Woodland Hills School District from September 2002 until now where he continues to be the Music Education teacher for children in grades 1-3. He is also certified to teach music education with youths from grades 1-12.

Paul's background includes: Michael's Restaurant (pianist for dinner music), Veronica's Veil Players (Board of Directors Member, Director, Actor, and Stage Crew), Harmony Singers, (Director), Seton-LaSalle High School (Director for Musicals, "Oklahoma" and "Miss Liberty")

Baldwin High School (Vocal Music Director for Musicals, "Oliver", "Brigadoon", "Singing in the Rain", "Barnum", "Oklahoma" and "Guys and Dolls"), Private piano instructor, Professional organizations (PMEA, MENC, NAPM and PSEA), Theatrical Productions (Freeport Music Festival, The Theatre Factory, Community Theatre Players, South Park Theater and Stage 62).

Paul is excited about joining our staff to serve the needs of North American Martyrs Parish. His duties will include: planning the music for all four weekend Masses (both churches) and coordinating the schedules of Karen McDonough, Doreen Franceschini and John Prucnal. He will play on Christmas, Holy Week, Easter, Holy Days of Obligation, sacramental celebrations such as First Communion and Confirmation and weddings. Typically, Paul will be the music minister for the weekly Saturday 4:00 Mass and the Sunday 11:00 Traditional Choir Mass. Paul will not only lead the traditional choir and work with cantors, but will begin a Children's Choir here and in time, enhance our Contemporary Choir. If you would like to join the Traditional Choir, become a cantor, join the Children's Choir or be part of a Contemporary Choir, please leave your name and phone # with our secretary, Charlotte, to pass along to Paul. We welcome Paul who brings a very prayerful spirit to the liturgy. By the way, his brother Andy, is Deacon Andy White who serves at St. Sylvester Parish, Brentwood, with one of my classmates, Fr. John Bachkay. It's a small world!

**THE INNOCENTS:** You will notice a pro-life artwork on loan to us for a week by artist, Nikki Bruni of St. Joseph Parish, Verona. The artwork is in the back of NAM Church by the votive candle area. Nikki will then bring the painting to St. Michael Church, Pitcairn for a week. This acrylic on canvas is an original rendition of French artist William Bouguereau's "L'Innocence". Attached to a self-standing unit, this 9' x 4 1/2 painting can be easily transported for showing. Within the larger image of Mary, Jesus and the Lamb, there are 2,366 tiny faces, representing the lives ended by abortion at Pittsburgh's Planned Parenthood in 2013. The 14 gold squares represent the lives saved during pro-life witnessing at that same clinic. The artist chose this image for her pro-life rendering because of the powerful way in which Jesus is depicted as the sacrificial victim, while still an infant.

The purpose of this artwork is two-fold: First, it is to memorialize each human life by giving them a name. As it travels, people will have the opportunity to give a name to a child that was aborted by writing in the book that accompanies it. Secondly, this work is meant to help us to recognize the tragedy of abortion, to realize what it has cost us, and to serve as an opportunity to grieve and to repent. Thank you Nikki for this marvelous, inspiring artwork!

The second annual Mass of Commissioning and Authorization for Lay Ecclesial Ministers will be celebrated on Sunday, November 8, 2015 at 2:30 p.m., in St. Paul Cathedral. On behalf of Bishop Zubik, I would like to invite you the parishioners to this Commissioning Mass at the Cathedral to join me in congratulating Elizabeth on taking this step to recognize her and other lay ecclesial ministers of the diocese who will formally recognized that day as a Pastoral Associate. Of course, this Mass will count for your Sunday obligation. The Cathedral can hold two thousand people. The bishop would like to see the cathedral filled on that day. Let's do our part to help support Elizabeth in thanking her for her becoming a Lay Ecclesial Minister.

## NEIGHBORHOOD 4, ST. JEAN DE BREBEUF

St. John de Brebeuf was one of the first Jesuit missionaries to reach Canada. He was a hardy frontiersman and established the first mission in 1625 near Lake Ontario. He was the first of the martyrs to be killed while preaching Christianity. In 1649, the Iroquois captured the Huron village of Saint Ignatius and he was killed. His courage was admired by the young native Americans. See what is happening in your neighborhood or to get involved, Call Elizabeth at 412-374-3980.

## NEIGHBORHOOD 5, ST. CHARLES GARNIER

St. Charles Garnier arrived in Canada in 1636. He, like the other martyrs, preached the faith to the Native Americans. He did much of his work in the Ossernenon village. ## NEIGHBORHOOD 6, ST. GABRIEL LALAMANT

St. Gabriel Lalemant arrived in 1648 at Fort St. Mary in Canada. In 1649 he joined Fr. Brebeuf at St. Ignatius. They worked at the mission there attempting to convert the Native Americans to Christianity. The mission was captured by the Iroquois tribe and he was taken prisoner and killed. One day in 1648 while he was saying mass in his frontier chapel he was killed.

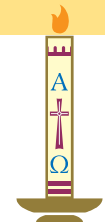
## NEIGHBORHOOD 8, ST. NOEL CHABANEL

St. Noel Chabanel came to Canada in 1643. He worked for 6 years among the Algonquin near Fort St. Mary. He disliked the cruel customs and tried to teach and show the Native Americans the Christian way. In 1649, he was killed out of hatred for the faith he was teaching to the Huron Indians.
