**SECURITY LIGHTING, SOUND SYSTEM AT ST. MICHAEL CHURCH, FR. STEVE UPDATE
INTERVIEWS FOR ADVANCEMENT DIRECTOR, MARCH FOR LIFE, COPING WITH LIFE ALONE**

SECURITY LIGHTING: I have authorized the addition of security lighting at St. Michael Church since it had been reported that it was very dark around the outside of the church and certain people were hanging out behind the church at night smoking and doing whatever. There are now two dusk to dawn security lights in the back of the church at both ends of the building, one light by the door with the handicap accessible entrance and one chimney light pointing on the back yard leading up to the former rectory. The cost estimate from Hanlon Electric for parts and labor was \$2,200. Now our staff and parishioners should feel even safer than they did before.

SOUND SYSTEM AT ST. MICHAEL CHURCH: When I was appointed pastor six years ago of both NAM Church and St. Michael Church, one of the first things I did was to upgrade the sound system at NAM Church and authorized Guardian Protection Systems to install an alarm system at St. Michael Church since I would not be residing in the St. Michael Rectory. Now it's time to upgrade the sound system at St. Michael Church due to frequent complaints of the inadequate sound system. I received two bids from reputable companies who install sound systems in churches. The lower bid has come from DCA, from McKees Rocks, for a cost of \$10,520 for new speakers, amplifiers, microphones etc. Fortunately, the Monroeville Knights of Columbus Trustees have agreed to donate \$2,000 toward this project. The rest of the expense we will have to pay through our Building and Grounds Account. **Please note that the Building & Grounds collection at both of our churches for the month of February will go directly to the St. Michael Church Sound System. Please be generous when it comes time for that collection.**

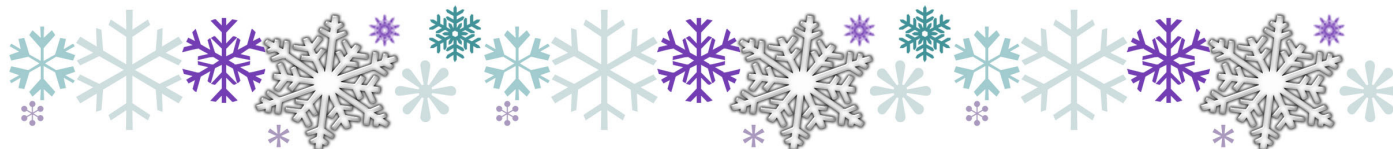
FR. STEVE UPDATE: Currently, Fr. Steve Chervenak is living with two of his sisters in Stowe, Ohio (near Akron) while recovering from the effects of the stroke he suffered. Our plan is for him to then go to a rehabilitation facility for a time before he can return to our parish. He is still very weak, is unable to drive and is considered a "fall risk". MANIFESTING THE SPIRIT

The Christmas season closes this Sunday with the Baptism of the Lord. This feast is a sister to last week's feast of the Epiphany. Each of them celebrates an "epiphany," or a manifestation of the Spirit of God in Jesus—first in his birth, and now at his baptism. The divine Spirit is manifested in all of the scriptures for this feast. Psalm 104 highlights the Spirit of God creating and renewing the earth, while the reading from Isaiah describes God restoring Israel. In Luke's account of the baptism of the Lord the Holy Spirit descends upon Jesus. And the letter to Titus reminds us that the Holy Spirit was "richly poured out" on us also, through the "bath of rebirth" (Titus 3:5, 6).

NEIGHBORHOOD 3, ST. JEAN DE LALANDE

NEIGHBORHOOD 4, ST. JEAN DE BREBEUF

St. John de Brebeuf was one of the first Jesuit missionaries to reach Canada. He was a hardy frontiersman and established the first mission in 1625 near Lake Ontario. He was the first of the martyrs to be killed while preaching Christianity. In 1649, the Iroquois captured the Huron village of Saint Ignatius and he was killed. NEIGHBORHOOD 5, ST. CHARLES GARNIER

St. Charles Garnier arrived in Canada in 1636. He, like the other martyrs, preached the faith to the Native Americans. He did much of his work in the Ossernenon village. In 1649, while working with a group of followers, he was killed by the Iroquois. To see what is happening in your neighborhood or to get involved, Call Elizabeth at 412-374-3980.

NEIGHBORHOOD 6, ST. GABRIEL LALAMANT

St. Gabriel Lalemant arrived in 1648 at Fort St. Mary in Canada. In 1649 he joined Fr. Brebeuf at St. Ignatius. They worked at the mission there attempting to convert the Native Americans to Christianity. The mission was captured by the Iroquois tribe and he was taken prisoner and killed. NEIGHBORHOOD 7, ST. ANTOINE DANIEL

St. Antoine Daniel came to see and stay in Canada in 1632. He preached Christianity to the Native Americans and started the school of our Lady of Angels in Quebec for Native American boys. Many of the Native Americans disliked the idea of their young boys being taught Christianity and the idea of a peaceful existence. One day in 1648 while he was saying Mass in his frontier chapel he was killed.

NEIGHBORHOOD 8, ST. NOEL CHABANEL

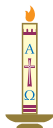
St. Noel Chabanel came to Canada in 1643. He worked for 6 years among the Algonquin near Fort St. Mary. He disliked the cruel customs and tried to teach and show the Native Americans the Christian way. In 1649, he was killed out of hatred for the faith he was teaching to the Huron Indians.
