UPDATE ON SCHOOL ADVANCEMENT DIRECTOR: My search team and I have conducted five interviews so far and my team and I need more time to arrive at a decision. Please pray that the Holy Spirit will guide the team to make the right recommendation and for me to make the right decision in the near future.

UNBOUND MINISTRY THANK YOU: **Fr. Jeremiah O'Shea**, who preached at all Masses as part of the "Unbound" ministry, wrote me a thank you card thanking the parishioners for their warm hospitality and in gratitude for **32 sponsorships** at our parish (including both of our churches). I also received a letter from **Jennifer Siebes**, representing Unbound U.S. Outreach. In her letter she thanks us for welcoming Fr. O'Shea. She also says, "Our hearts are full of gratitude for the generosity you and your parishioners have shown to the children, youth and the aging in our sponsorship program. Through your willingness to partner with Unbound, your parish community has taken steps toward a closer walk with Jesus in the name of the poor."

MARCH FOR LIFE/DAY OF PRAYER: There are two different buses leaving for the March for Life. One will be a bus with youth and adult chaperones from both NAM Church and St. Bernadette Church leaving on Thursday afternoon, January 21 and staying overnight in D.C. and returning the evening of Friday, Jan. 22. The school children will join me and all present, as we pray the rosary for life. Adoration will be all day with a Holy Hour from 4:00 to 5:00. Please come and pray with us to protect the lives of unborn children, for repentance for those who have had abortions or who have supported abortions and for an overturning of the Roe vs. Wade Law so that children's lives will be protected from the moment of conception until natural death.

COPING WITH LIVING ALONE: In this Jubilee Year of Mercy, I am offering a seminar entitled "*Baby it's cold outside: Coping with living alone*" on Tuesday, January 26 at 7:00 pm at DeLuca Hall. This seminar is for anyone who is separated, divorced or widowed and will be presented by *Beginning Experience* which consists of men and women from the Diocese of Pittsburgh who are part of a team who help others to cope with life's transitions, particularly for those separated, divorced and widowed. SECOND COLLECTION

The Pittsburgh Diocese is home to two nationally recognized educational programs for children with special needs: St. Anthony School Programs and DePaul School for Hearing and Speech (formerly known as The DePaul Institute). A special collection to benefit these two organizations will be taken this weekend, **January 16 & 17** at all Masses at each parish.

St. Anthony School Programs provides children with Intellectual Disabilities/Autism Catholic special education in five elementary /intermediate classrooms, two secondary classrooms and a college-age program located on the campus of Duquesne University with training sites at Carlow University and the University of Pittsburgh. St. Anthony's also offers an academic component to the curriculum through Carlow University for qualified post-secondary students.

DePaul School for Hearing and Speech provides Listening and spoken Language (LSL) education to children who are deaf or hard of hearing. Without the use of sign language, DePaul students learn to listen and speak and successfully transition to their neighborhood schools alongside their peers with typical hearing.

Your donation will help St. Anthony School Programs and DePaul School for Hearing and Speech to further their goals of providing quality educational programs and services to their students. NEIGHBORHOOD 4, ST. JEAN DE BREBEUF

St. John de Brebeuf was one of the first Jesuit missionaries to reach Canada. He was a hardy frontiersman and established the first mission in 1625 near Lake Ontario. He was the first of the martyrs to be killed while preaching Christianity. In 1649, the Iroquois captured the Huron village of Saint Ignatius and he was killed. His courage was admired by the young native Americans. See what is happening in your neighborhood or to get involved, Call Elizabeth at 412-374-3980.

NEIGHBORHOOD 5, ST. CHARLES GARNIER

St. Charles Garnier arrived in Canada in 1636. He, like the other martyrs, preached the faith to the Native Americans. He did much of his work in the Ossernenon village. In 1649, while working with a group of followers, he was killed by the Iroquois. To see what is happening in your neighborhood or to get involved, Call Elizabeth at 412-374-3980.

NEIGHBORHOOD 6, ST. GABRIEL LALAMANT

St. Gabriel Lalemant arrived in 1648 at Fort St. Mary in Canada. In 1649 he joined Fr. Brebeuf at St. Ignatius. They worked at the mission there attempting to convert the Native Americans to Christianity. The mission was captured by the Iroquois tribe and he was taken prisoner and killed. NEIGHBORHOOD 7, ST. ANTOINE DANIEL

St. Antoine Daniel came to see and stay in Canada in 1632. He preached Christianity to the Native Americans and started the school of our Lady of Angels in Quebec for Native American boys. Many of the Native Americans disliked the idea of their young boys being taught Christianity and the idea of a peaceful existence. One day in 1648 while he was saying Mass in his frontier chapel he was killed.

NEIGHBORHOOD 8, ST. NOEL CHABANEL

St. Noel Chabanel came to Canada in 1643. He worked for 6 years among the Algonquin near Fort St. Mary. He disliked the cruel customs and tried to teach and show the Native Americans the Christian way. In 1649, he was killed out of hatred for the faith he was teaching to the Huron Indians.
