NEW ADVANCEMENT DIRECTOR, PARISH SHARE, MONROEVILLE MINISTERIUM SCHOLARSHIP

NEW ADVANCEMENT DIRECTOR: I am happy to announce that **Danielle Cole** is the new part-time Advancement Director for NAM School. As such she will support and promote the school mission by implementing and overseeing development activities necessary to grow the North American Martyrs School enrollment and expand the base of financial support from a broad range of sources. The Advancement Director will do her best to build relationships both in the school, the parish community and the local community at large. Danielle is currently our part-time Before/After School Care Coordinator and will take on the additional duties of part-time Advancement Director effective immediately.

Danielle is a NAM School graduate. After high school, she attended Pennsylvania State University at University Park, PA where she earned a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Psychology. She was also a Resident Assistant at Penn State from 2011 to 2013. She was a student assistant from 2009 to 2013 as part of the Rural Urban Leadership Program. She was also worked for Monroeville Parks and Recreation from 2009-2013 as a Summer Park Leader and Arts & Crafts Coordinator. Since 2003 Danielle has served as a Private Child Care Provider for many families in the Monroeville area and has earned a reputation as a responsible, organized and compassionate child care provider.

Danielle will be assisted in her new role by **Dave Haseleu** who served as the Advancement Director for Holy Trinity Catholic School in Robinson Township for five years, during which time he boosted their enrollment. Because of Dave's experience in advancement, enrollment management, development and communications, he will serve as mentor to Danielle and will be a real asset to her and to our parish. Dave is married with five children and lives in Coraopolis. He will be offering his services to us *pro bono* and has already met with our school principal, Jessica, our business manager, Tim and myself as well as touring the school and attending our last PTG meeting.

PARISH SHARE: The Parish Share goal assigned to our parish for the 2015-2016 year was \$87,200. Each of the 200 parishes of the Diocese of Pittsburgh contributes Parish Share monies yearly to help defray the normal day-to-day expenses of the diocese. Depending on our yearly Offertory Collections, an algorithm is used by diocesan officials to determine the parish share goal for that particular parish for the coming year. Due to your generous giving, we have collected \$88,696.56 during this same period. This means that we have exceeded the goal by \$1,496.56 for which I am grateful. Anything over the amount that we collect are not assessed the 17.6 % as our parish monies are assessed by the diocese (a diocesan rule).

Soon you will be getting the new Parish Share Appeal letter in the mail for the 2016-2017 Parish Share Campaign. Our new Parish Share goal assigned to us is \$90,193. This amount exceeds last year's amount by nearly \$3,000 which is not unusual. For the last two years, I have asked each household of our parish to contribute \$225.00 toward that goal. This year, I'm asking you to contribute \$250.00 for Parish Share so that we can reach and exceed our goal as we did this year. I thank you in advance for your support of the Parish Share Appeal.

NEIGHBORHOOD 4, ST. JEAN DE BREBEUF

St. John de Brebeuf was one of the first Jesuit missionaries to reach Canada. He was a hardy frontiersman and established the first mission in 1625 near Lake Ontario. He was the first of the martyrs to be killed while preaching Christianity. In 1649, the Iroquois captured the Huron village of Saint Ignatius and he was killed. NEIGHBORHOOD 5, ST. CHARLES GARNIER

St. Charles Garnier arrived in Canada in 1636. He, like the other martyrs, preached the faith to the Native Americans. He did much of his work in the Ossernenon village. In 1649, while working with a group of followers, he was killed by the Iroquois. To see what is happening in your neighborhood or to get involved, Call Elizabeth at 412-374-3980.

NEIGHBORHOOD 6, ST. GABRIEL LALAMANT

St. Gabriel Lalemant arrived in 1648 at Fort St. Mary in Canada. In 1649 he joined Fr. Brebeuf at St. Ignatius. They worked at the mission there attempting to convert the Native Americans to Christianity. The mission was captured by the Iroquois tribe and he was taken prisoner and killed. NEIGHBORHOOD 7, ST. ANTOINE DANIEL

St. Antoine Daniel came to see and stay in Canada in 1632. He preached Christianity to the Native Americans and started the school of our Lady of Angels in Quebec for Native American boys. Many of the Native Americans disliked the idea of their young boys being taught Christianity and the idea of a peaceful existence. One day in 1648 while he was saying Mass in his frontier chapel he was killed.

NEIGHBORHOOD 8, ST. NOEL CHABANEL

St. Noel Chabanel came to Canada in 1643. He worked for 6 years among the Algonquin near Fort St. Mary. He disliked the cruel customs and tried to teach and show the Native Americans the Christian way. In 1649, he was killed out of hatred for the faith he was teaching to the Huron Indians.
