***EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION DAY, ASH WEDNESDAY, WORLD MARRIAGE DAY, LIVING STATIONS, HEBREW FREE LOAN ASSOCIATION, CONSOLING THE HEART OF JESUS***

***EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION DAY:*** This Monday, February 8, is our monthly Eucharistic Adoration Day. I will expose the Blessed Sacrament after Mass and the church will remain open all day with a holy hour from 7:00 pm to 8:00 pm. Please come and spend some time with the Lord to adore his goodness and mercy.

***ASH WEDNESDAY:*** This year, Lent comes early with Ash Wednesday on February 10. There will be a choice for three Masses for you: 9:00 am school Mass at NAM Church, 12:15 Mass at NAM Church and 7:00 pm CCD Mass at NAM Church. I will also be having a Mass for the residents of Broadview Manor, Pitcairn at 1:00 pm. Remember, it is a day of fast and abstinence which means only one full meal (you may have two smaller meals as well) for anyone between the ages of 18 and 59. It also means no meat for all those who are 14 or older. While it is not a holy day of obligation, what better way to begin the Season of Lent than by coming to Mass on Ash Wednesday!

***WORLD MARRIAGE DAY:*** Next Sunday, February 14 is World Marriage Day which is typically on the second Sunday of February. This year it falls on Valentine's Day. Our parish will be celebrating World Marriage Day at all four Masses beginning with the 4:00 Mass on Saturday, February 13. For those of you who are married, please prepare to come to Mass with your spouse so that you may renew your marriage vows together following the prompts of the priest celebrant.

***LIVING STATIONS:*** I am happy to announce that **St. Ferdinand Catholic Church Youth Ministry**, in Cranberry Township, will be coming to NAM Church on Sunday, February 14, the First Sunday of Lent, from 7:30 pm to 8:30 pm to present the Living Stations. The last time they came to our parish was in March of 2012. This touring group has been presenting the Living Stations in various Catholic churches of the Diocese of Pittsburgh for the last 32 years. The group consists of 90 persons: 41 cast members, 8 readers, 16 crew members and 26 adults. They will be bringing their own costumes, props, sight and sound system to enact the Stations with music to portray the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. A free will offering will be taken up at the end of the Stations to help offset their costs. Rather than waiting until Holy Week to get into gear this Lenten Season, why not 'jumpstart' your Lent by coming to the Living Stations? I can assure you, it will inspire you to be more like Jesus.

***HEBREW FREE LOAN ASSOCIATION:*** Through my participation in the Monroeville Interfaith Ministerium I have learned of the **Hebrew Free Loan Association Pittsburgh** which is one of the original microlenders in the United States. Based on the Biblical mandate not to collect interest when lending money to those in need, HFLA has been helping people become and remain self-sufficient since 1887. Loans are available regardless of religion, race, age, national origin, gender, or sexual orientation provided that the borrower meets HFLA's requirements. Applicants must have a source of income (full-time or part-time work) and be permanent residents of Allegheny County. Loans typically require a cosigner who has a source of income, has good credit, and owns property in Allegheny County. Applicants can borrow from \$500.00 to \$10,000. Repayment of the loan usually begins 30 days after it is issued and borrowers normally repay for 24-36 months or up to 50 months. The terms of repayment will be arranged to suit the ability of the borrower to pay. Making monthly payments on time could help a borrower qualify for future loans. Some reasons for taking out a loan include but are not limited to: auto loans, small business expenses, family emergency, summer camp, medical bills, tuition, home improvement, debt consolidation, car repair, adoption fees and wedding. Appointments occur on Tuesday nights at the HFLA office in Greenfield in which a committee of three or four HFLA board members will meet with you and review your loan application. To apply, visit [hflapgh.org](http://hflapgh.org) or call the Hebrew Free Loan Association at **412-422-8868** to schedule a confidential appointment. Applicants need to bring: photo ID, proof of income (paycheck stubs or tax return) and proof of the need for a loan (e.g., tuition bill, medical bill, vehicle/home repair estimate, etc.)

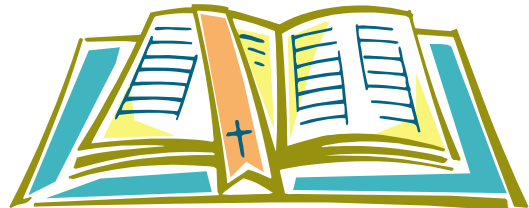

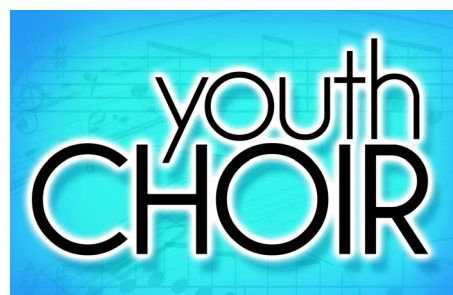

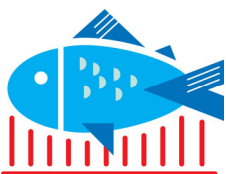

## NEIGHBORHOOD 4, ST. JEAN DE BREBEUF

St. John de Brebeuf was one of the first Jesuit missionaries to reach Canada. He was a hardy frontiersman and established the first mission in 1625 near Lake Ontario. He was the first of the martyrs to be killed while preaching Christianity. In 1649, the Iroquois captured the Huron village of Saint Ignatius and he was killed. His courage was admired by the young native Americans. See what is happening in your neighborhood or to get involved, Call Elizabeth at 412-374-3980.

## NEIGHBORHOOD 5, ST. CHARLES GARNIER

St. Charles Garnier arrived in Canada in 1636. He, like the other martyrs, preached the faith to the Native Americans. He did much of his work in the Ossernenon village. In 1649, while working with a group of followers, he was killed by the Iroquois. To see what is happening in your neighborhood or to get involved, Call Elizabeth at 412-374-3980.

## NEIGHBORHOOD 6, ST. GABRIEL LALAMANT

St. Gabriel Lalemant arrived in 1648 at Fort St. Mary in Canada. In 1649 he joined Fr. Brebeuf at St. Ignatius. They worked at the mission there attempting to convert the Native Americans to Christianity. The mission was captured by the Iroquois tribe and he was taken prisoner and killed. ## NEIGHBORHOOD 7, ST. ANTOINE DANIEL

St. Antoine Daniel came to see and stay in Canada in 1632. He preached Christianity to the Native Americans and started the school of our Lady of Angels in Quebec for Native American boys. Many of the Native Americans disliked the idea of their young boys being taught Christianity and the idea of a peaceful existence. One day in 1648 while he was saying Mass in his frontier chapel he was killed.

## NEIGHBORHOOD 8, ST. NOEL CHABANEL

St. Noel Chabanel came to Canada in 1643. He worked for 6 years among the Algonquin near Fort St. Mary. He disliked the cruel customs and tried to teach and show the Native Americans the Christian way. In 1649, he was killed out of hatred for the faith he was teaching to the Huron Indians.

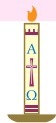
