**9:30 am:** Depart North American Martyrs Church in Monroeville

**10:00 am:** St. Anthony's Chapel – 1700 Harpster St. Troy Hill, 15212

This amazing Pittsburgh Historic Landmark was built as a shrine to St. Anthony of Padua and houses a collection of over 5,000 Holy Relics. It is 2<sup>nd</sup> only to the Vatican in most Holy Relics. This collection was amassed by Father Suitbert Mollinger, first pastor of Most Holy Name of Jesus Parish. In addition to the relics, Father Mollinger acquired a priceless set of life-sized carved wooden Stations of the Cross.

**11:30 am:** Elegant luncheon at the 20<sup>th</sup> Century Club in Oakland.

This historic landmark located in the heart of Oakland features 16<sup>th</sup> Century Italian Renaissance Revival style architecture. The club was Founded in 1894 as a Private Women's Club with its goal to promote intellectual and artistic pursuits, as well as social well-being.
