**THANK YOU:** Thanks to all of you who have prayed for me, send get well cards, given me rides and brought meals for me after last Tuesday's surgery on my right rotator cuff. Thanks be to God I am responding well to physical therapy and the pain is manageable and getting less each day. I must keep my arm in a sling for a total of six weeks after surgery. I suppose I am getting use to sleeping in the recliner but I miss my bed. The good news is that I started celebrating Masses as the main celebrant this past Monday and have resumed my normal schedule. I do not need any more cards, rides or meals but do appreciate the prayers! Thank you again for your love and support!

**CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS UPDATE:** The "Please Advise" Committee of the bishop met on Friday, April 1 and approved of the three cost estimates presented by each of the three contractors interested in bidding for both the NAM school office/entrance expansion and the Eucharistic chapel projects. Tim and I have been told that the next step is for both of us and our architect, **Luke Desmone**, to appear before the Diocesan Construction Committee at the seminary on Tuesday, May 24. After that meeting, I will keep you informed as to the next steps so that, hopefully, we can break ground soon!

**SCHOOL FUNDRAISING/DONATIONS:** Thanks to all of you who supported our Lenten Fish Fry for making it such a success! The net profit is approximately \$39,488.00 which exceeds last year by \$4,000! This is due to the hard work by **Co-Chairpersons Jennifer Speranza & Jennifer O'Connor and all the volunteers who worked so hard preparing food, setting up, serving food, busing tables, working at the fish fry hotline, preparing take-out orders and cleaning up. Congratulations!** This money will only be used for School expenses as part of the School Fundraising Goal of raising \$125,000 this year. Thanks to all of you who patronized our fish fry and other school fund-raisers, we are on course to reach our goal!

When **Diane Fleet** was our principal, she and I worked hard to get an Educational Improvement Tax Credit from Compunetix Inc. , an international conference call corporation whose headquarters is located on Mossie Boulevard. Through much prayer and perseverance, the founder of Compunetix, **Giorgio Coraluppi** has donated a check for \$5,000 to our school! Many thanks to **Giorgio**, his wife **Luisa**, who taught me Latin at Duquesne University Graduate school, and to their daughter, **Sabina**, who is the Director of Operations for Compunetix.

Each year our school sponsors its annual "Blue and Gold Walk-a-thon" as the school children and teachers walk around the school and church campus, after soliciting sponsors who will donate so many cents per lap for each child. This year it will be on Friday, April 29 beginning at 1:00 pm. I hope to walk with the children this year as I often do. This year I am asking whoever wants to sponsor me for so many cents per lap to please do so by calling me at ext. 11 and leaving a message for me. All of the proceeds will benefit North American Martyrs School.

**YOUTH GROUP SUMMER SERVICE TRIP:** Our youth minister, **Chris Manderino** and I have been planning a trip to Chicago for July 24 through July 30, 2016 for a **Catholic Heart Workcamp Trip**. This is a service trip like Habitat for Humanity. Catholic Heart Workcamp is a national organization that selects various U.S. cities for certain weeks throughout the summer for service projects. The initial cost is \$350.00 per student. We hope that the final cost per student will be as low as \$150.00 due to money left over from the March for Life (cancelled due to the blizzard) and fund-raising by the youth group. Chris and I will be among the adults going as we hope to rent vans to drive westward. The ratio of adults to youth will be at least 1 to 7. This is an opportunity for teens to link up with teens from other dioceses who will be working at the same site. As of this date, this is the plan for students in grades 9 through 12. Any adult interested in going must be in compliance with the Safe Environment Policy of our parish/diocese. This is a wonderful opportunity to make new friends and deepen old friendships. 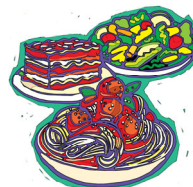

## NEIGHBORHOOD 4, ST. JEAN DE BREBEUF

St. John de Brebeuf was one of the first Jesuit missionaries to reach Canada. He was a hardy frontiersman and established the first mission in 1625 near Lake Ontario. He was the first of the martyrs to be killed while preaching Christianity. In 1649, the Iroquois captured the Huron village of Saint Ignatius and he was killed. ## NEIGHBORHOOD 5, ST. CHARLES GARNIER

St. Charles Garnier arrived in Canada in 1636. He, like the other martyrs, preached the faith to the Native Americans. He did much of his work in the Ossernenon village. ## NEIGHBORHOOD 6, ST. GABRIEL LALAMANT

St. Gabriel Lalemant arrived in 1648 at Fort St. Mary in Canada. In 1649 he joined Fr. Brebeuf at St. Ignatius. They worked at the mission there attempting to convert the Native Americans to Christianity. The mission was captured by the Iroquois tribe and he was taken prisoner and killed. ## NEIGHBORHOOD 7, ST. ANTOINE DANIEL

St. Antoine Daniel came to see and stay in Canada in 1632. He preached Christianity to the Native Americans and started the school of our Lady of Angels in Quebec for Native American boys. Many of the Native Americans disliked the idea of their young boys being taught Christianity and the idea of a peaceful existence. One day in 1648 while he was saying Mass in his frontier chapel he was killed.

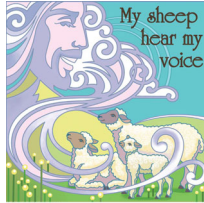
## NEIGHBORHOOD 8, ST. NOEL CHABANEL

St. Noel Chabanel came to Canada in 1643. He worked for 6 years among the Algonquin near Fort St. Mary. He disliked the cruel customs and tried to teach and show the Native Americans the Christian way. In 1649, he was killed out of hatred for the faith he was teaching to the Huron Indians.
