PARISH PASTORAL PLAN, THANK YOU, FIRST COMMUNION, FEAST OF THE ASCENSION

PARISH PASTORAL PLAN: Our past Parish Pastoral Plan spanned the years of 2013 through 2015. You may recall that 1600 of these booklets were printed and mailed to each household of the parish at the cost of about \$1,300. The **Pastoral Council** and I (with the assistance of Elizabeth Trexler) have spent two meetings dedicated to discerning our goals and long-term objectives of our parish for the next three years. In addition, we spent our most recent Pastoral Council meeting this past Monday night revising the language of the long-term objectives for the last time. I am very proud of the document in its final draft. It symbolizes a vibrant parish with three primary goals: Evangelization, Catechesis and Stewardship/Formation. With the able assistance of **Cindy Pascoe** and **Elizabeth Trexler**, this document should be ready for printing soon and we hope to have them available to everyone by Pentecost Sunday, May, 15, 2016. This time, we will have printed only 1,000 copies of the document at about half the cost. We intend to put the Parish Pastoral Plan on our parish website as well as e-mailing it to those who already have given their e-mails to us as part of the NAM Parish Newsletter. In addition, during Pentecost weekend, we will have these booklets in the vestibule of each of our churches for each family to pick up after Mass on that weekend. We will not be mailing any of these booklets to our parishioners in order to save the cost of postage. We will have some available in the welcome tent at the Parish Festival as well as keeping some on hand for new parishioners. Remember that this Pastoral Plan is for years 2016-2018 so we want additional copies on hand for the next two years. I look forward to you reading it and keeping it handy as a parish resource for the next three years. Please pray for the success of our Parish Pastoral Plan.

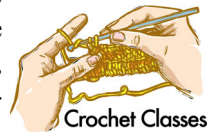

THE MAY CROWNING Ceremony will be held after the 9:00 AM Mass on Thursday, **May 5**. Please join our students as they participate in the flower procession.



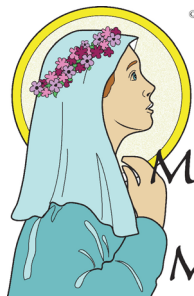

NEIGHBORHOOD 3, ST. JEAN DE LALANDE

Since 1952, the first Thursday in May has been recognized as the National Day of Prayer. The Day of Prayer belongs to all Americans and transcends differences, bringing together citizens to celebrate our most beloved freedom; the freedom to humbly come before God and seek His guidance.

NEIGHBORHOOD 4, ST. JEAN DE BREBEUF

St. John de Brebeuf was one of the first Jesuit missionaries to reach Canada. He was a hardy frontiersman and established the first mission in 1625 near Lake Ontario. He was the first of the martyrs to be killed while preaching Christianity. In 1649, the Iroquois captured the Huron village of Saint Ignatius and he was killed. His courage was admired by the young native Americans. See what is happening in your neighborhood or to get involved, Call Elizabeth at 412-374-3980.

NEIGHBORHOOD 5, ST. CHARLES GARNIER

St. Charles Garnier arrived in Canada in 1636. He, like the other martyrs, preached the faith to the Native Americans. He did much of his work in the Ossernenon village. In 1649, while working with a group of followers, he was killed by the Iroquois. To see what is happening in your neighborhood or to get involved, Call Elizabeth at 412-374-3980.

NEIGHBORHOOD 6, ST. GABRIEL LALAMANT

St. Gabriel Lalemant arrived in 1648 at Fort St. Mary in Canada. In 1649 he joined Fr. Brebeuf at St. Ignatius. They worked at the mission there attempting to convert the Native Americans to Christianity. The mission was captured by the Iroquois tribe and he was taken prisoner and killed. NEIGHBORHOOD 7, ST. ANTOINE DANIEL

St. Antoine Daniel came to see and stay in Canada in 1632. He preached Christianity to the Native Americans and started the school of our Lady of Angels in Quebec for Native American boys. Many of the Native Americans disliked the idea of their young boys being taught Christianity and the idea of a peaceful existence. One day in 1648 while he was saying Mass in his frontier chapel he was killed.

NEIGHBORHOOD 8, ST. NOEL CHABANEL

St. Noel Chabanel came to Canada in 1643. He worked for 6 years among the Algonquin near Fort St. Mary. He disliked the cruel customs and tried to teach and show the Native Americans the Christian way. In 1649, he was killed out of hatred for the faith he was teaching to the Huron Indians.
