*PARISH CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS, ELIZABETH'S TRIP, CORPUS CHRISTI ADORATION,
MEMORIAL DAY, ST. ANTHONY ITALIAN MASS*



PARISH CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS: On Wednesday, May 25, I had a meeting with the General Secretary of the Diocese, **Fr. Larry DiNardo**, along with our Regional Vicar, **Fr. Fred Cain**, Associate General Secretary, **Linda Ritzert** and Director of Property Planning and Development, **Paul Iurlano**. We discussed both church building projects, namely, 1) the Expansion of the School Entrance with Administrative Offices and 2) the Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration Chapel. It was noted that both projects were approved at the Construction Committee meeting at St. Paul Seminary on Tuesday, May 24, insofar as the conceptual and schematic drawings were submitted by the architect **Luke Desmone** and approved. We are now at the phase in which Luke Desmone is waiting for my permission to begin working on the construction drawings.

It was the collective wisdom of all four diocesan officials that we should postpone both construction projects until at least December 2016 or January 2017. By this time, the fall meetings of On Mission for the Church Alive will have concluded and there will be a clearer direction on the use of all church buildings, schools, health care institutions etc. The concern is that if I, as pastor, would ask the architect to prepare construction drawings for both projects, the cost for the drawings themselves may be as much as \$40,000 that would be drawn from the Church Alive monies from donors from our parish. What if the bishop chooses a different model than we anticipate? Then I would be wasting your hard-earned donations. That would not be responsible stewardship. It would be more prudent to wait for the permission to proceed. If the permission is granted, then these same diocesan officials think that construction would begin on both projects after the last day of school in the spring of 2017.

Even if I was to go ahead with the project now, by the time the Construction drawings are completed, it would be the end of July. Then they would have to be put out for bid. That may take as much as a month to get the bids back. Then we would need approval from the Municipality of Monroeville for our building permits and I may need to go before the Consultors Board of the diocese one last time. In other words, in a best case scenario, construction would begin in September which is when school is in session! I wouldn't want the noise, dirt, dust and mud to disrupt teaching in the classrooms. It would be a mess!

Reluctantly, I came around to the thinking of the four diocesan officials to postpone the projects for now. Besides, if both projects begin simultaneously, we would save more money by using heavy equipment such as cranes and bulldozers for both projects together rather than one at a time. Please continue to pray for the success of both projects. Thank you for your Church Alive donations. As the money accrues, we will draw from it at a later time.

ELIZABETH'S TRIP: Most of you should know by now that **Elizabeth Trexler**, our Pastoral Associate, will be going to Central Asia on a missionary trip with eight other college students (not from our parish). Elizabeth will be gone the months of June and July and will return to our parish on August 1, 2016. I will be commissioning Elizabeth at the 8:00 Mass this Sunday "As a missionary to proclaim the gospel". Please keep her and the others with her in your prayers. (While Elizabeth is gone, Sr. Mary Clark, SC will fill in for Elizabeth on an "as needed" basis for funeral home visitation and funerals. Sr. Mary Clark is 75 and lives with other sisters in Brookline.) There will be a donut reception for her after the 8:00 am Mass in DeLuca Hall. Come and join us and bid farewell to Elizabeth!

CORPUS CHRISTI ADORATION: As we do every year, we will have Eucharistic Adoration on Corpus Christi Sunday, May 29, with exposition of the Blessed Sacrament after the 11:00 Mass. I hope to have an outdoor procession with the Blessed Sacrament with one trip around our church and school (weather permitting) at 4:00 that afternoon followed by prayers before the Eucharist and Benediction and Reposition at 4:50. Please come and join us as we adore the Lord together.

MEMORIAL DAY: Please join us at Mass for Memorial Day at 8:00 am at NAM Church. In addition, I have been asked by Pitcairn Mayor **Betsy Stevick**, to lead the invocation in front of the Park Building (on Broadway Ave.) at 11:00 am on Memorial Day to which I have agreed. Let's do all we can to remember our veterans who sacrificed their own safety and comfort and in many cases, gave their own lives for the price of our freedom.

ST. ANTHONY ITALIAN MASS: I am happy to announce that my friend, **Fr. Benedetto Vaghetto**, will be the main celebrant for the Italian Mass on the Feast of St. Anthony, June 13 at St. Michael Church at 7:00 pm. The Mass will be in Italian (with English subtitles in the program booklet) and his homily will be in English. We will process with the statue of St. Anthony of Padua down Wall Avenue for about ¼ mile after Mass as we sing joyful songs. This will be followed by a "Festa" Italian food celebration at St. Michael Hall which is accessible by elevator and is air-conditioned. We will have wonderful Italian music. 
SECOND COLLECTION

NEIGHBORHOOD 3, ST. JEAN DE LALANDE

NEIGHBORHOOD 4, ST. JEAN DE BREBEUF

St. John de Brebeuf was one of the first Jesuit missionaries to reach Canada. He was a hardy frontiersman and established the first mission in 1625 near Lake Ontario. He was the first of the martyrs to be killed while preaching Christianity. In 1649, the Iroquois captured the Huron village of Saint Ignatius and he was killed. His courage was admired by the young native Americans. To see what is happening in your neighborhood or to get involved, Call Elizabeth at 412-374-3980.

NEIGHBORHOOD 5, ST. CHARLES GARNIER

St. Charles Garnier arrived in Canada in 1636. He, like the other martyrs, preached the faith to the Native Americans. He did much of his work in the Ossernenon village. In 1649, while working with a group of followers, he was killed by the Iroquois. To see what is happening in your neighborhood or to get involved, Call Elizabeth at 412-374-3980.

NEIGHBORHOOD 6, ST. GABRIEL LALAMANT

St. Gabriel Lalemant arrived in 1648 at Fort St. Mary in Canada. In 1649 he joined Fr. Brebeuf at St. Ignatius. They worked at the mission there attempting to convert the Native Americans to Christianity. The mission was captured by the Iroquois tribe and he was taken prisoner and killed. NEIGHBORHOOD 7, ST. ANTOINE DANIEL

St. Antoine Daniel came to see and stay in Canada in 1632. He preached Christianity to the Native Americans and started the school of our Lady of Angels in Quebec for Native American boys. Many of the Native Americans disliked the idea of their young boys being taught Christianity and the idea of a peaceful existence. One day in 1648 while he was saying Mass in his frontier chapel he was killed.


NEIGHBORHOOD 8, ST. NOEL CHABANEL

St. Noel Chabanel came to Canada in 1643. He worked for 6 years among the Algonquin near Fort St. Mary. He disliked the cruel customs and tried to teach and show the Native Americans the Christian way. In 1649, he was killed out of hatred for the faith he was teaching to the Huron Indians.
