PASTORAL ASSOCIATE POSITION, RCIA, BISHOP ZUBIK LETTER ON ABORTION AD

PASTORAL ASSOCIATE POSITION: My search team of John Kearns, Cathie Snyder, Kathy Haberstroh, Donna Lew-Buechel and Tim Thorsen and I met with three different candidates for interviews last Friday for the Pastoral Associate position. There were many more who applied for the position, but I narrowed it down to three. Two of the three were high quality candidates. I'm going to use the time this week at the multi-day convocation with Bishop Zubik and my brother priests to pray about my decision. It was practically a tie between the two top candidates. I will be meeting with one of those candidates on Friday. A decision will be forthcoming.

RCIA: Once again this year it's time to begin the **Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)**. This is a program lasting about 27 weeks of weekly classes that my team and I will lead for those adults who are: unbaptized, baptized into a non-Catholic church, and those who have been baptized Catholics but never received Reconciliation, Holy Eucharist or Confirmation. The classes will again be on Wednesday evenings at 7:00 pm – 8:30 pm beginning on September 28 at the Teacher's Lounge of the school. We will break for Thanksgiving, Christmas and Holy Week. BISHOP ZUBIK LETTER ON ABORTION AD:

**Statement of Bishop Zubik
On
Nation-wide Abortion Ad
September 23, 2016**

An organization that campaigns for tax-funded abortions has bought newspaper ads nationwide, claiming that a Catholic can support the choice to have an abortion "in good faith." Bishop David A. Zubik has issued this response:

An ad campaign claiming that it's possible for a Catholic to support public funding for abortion "in good faith" is wrong in every sense of that word. As Pope Francis wrote in his encyclical *Amoris Laetitia*, "So great is the value of a human life, and so inalienable the right to life of an innocent child growing in the mother's womb, that no alleged right to one's own body can justify a decision to terminate that life . . . which can never be considered the 'property' of another."

This ad campaign attempts to mislead the public into believing that a Catholic can support access to abortion in good conscience. Nothing could be further from the truth. Instead, the Church seeks to respect lives that others might see as disposable and asks Catholics and all people of good will to defend the absolute value of human life.

The teaching of the Church on abortion is irrevocably established. It is grounded in the belief that all life, from the first moment of conception to the moment of natural death, is sacred. The most basic principle of human rights is that every human life is an irreplaceable treasure. The unborn baby is as entitled to and dependent upon our care as is an infant. Page 2 of 2 9/14/16

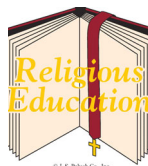

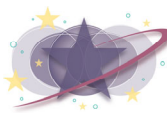

NEIGHBORHOOD 4, ST. JEAN DE BREBEUF

St. John de Brebeuf was one of the first Jesuit missionaries to reach Canada. He was a hardy frontiersman and established the first mission in 1625 near Lake Ontario. He was the first of the martyrs to be killed while preaching Christianity. In 1649, the Iroquois captured the Huron village of Saint Ignatius and he was killed. His courage was admired by the young native Americans.

NEIGHBORHOOD 5, ST. CHARLES GARNIER

St. Charles Garnier arrived in Canada in 1636. He, like the other martyrs, preached the faith to the Native Americans. He did much of his work in the Ossernenon village. In 1649, while working with a group of followers, he was killed by the Iroquois.

NEIGHBORHOOD 6, ST. GABRIEL LALAMANT

St. Gabriel Lalemant arrived in 1648 at Fort St. Mary in Canada. In 1649 he joined Fr. Brebeuf at St. Ignatius. They worked at the mission there attempting to convert the Native Americans to Christianity. The mission was captured by the Iroquois tribe and he was taken prisoner and killed.

NEIGHBORHOOD 7, ST. ANTOINE DANIEL

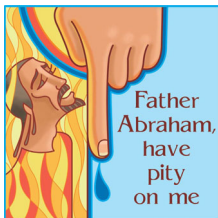
St. Antoine Daniel came to see and stay in Canada in 1632. He preached Christianity to the Native Americans and started the school of our Lady of Angels in Quebec for Native American boys. Many of the Native Americans disliked the idea of their young boys being taught Christianity and the idea of a peaceful existence. One day in 1648 while he was saying Mass in his frontier chapel he was killed.

NEIGHBORHOOD 8, ST. NOEL CHABANEL

St. Noel Chabanel came to Canada in 1643. He worked for 6 years among the Algonquin near Fort St. Mary. He disliked the cruel customs and tried to teach and show the Native Americans the Christian way. In 1649, he was killed out of hatred for the faith he was teaching to the Huron Indians.

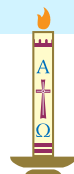
