*DOOR-TO-DOOR EVANGELIZATION, FIRE RALLY, ON MISSION PARISH SESSION,
LECTORS NEEDED*



DOOR-TO-DOOR EVANGELIZATION: On October 23, World Mission Sunday, our parish will begin our Door-to-Door Evangelization in Neighborhood One. So far, we have four teams of two. We will be going out to share our faith as well as updating census information for those registered in our parish. We will have brochures, DVD's, parish bulletins and other information to pass out to those we visit if they are interested. We are also open to their prayer requests. If you would like to be part of our team, please contact me as soon as possible. I'm only asking a commitment of going out on census calls part of one day each week. There is also a Basic Evangelization Training for each participant that must be completed before going out. This training can be accomplished on-line for free with our parish's membership in St. Paul Street Evangelization. If you don't have a computer, then I can give to you handouts of the lessons.

FIRE RALLY: *The New Evangelization for the New Millennium Conference* will be held at the Monroeville Convention Center on Saturday, November 5, from 1:00 pm to 5:30 pm with the 4:30 pm Mass celebrated by **Bishop David Zubik**. It will follow the format of a FIRE Rally (standing for **F for Faith, I for Intercession, R for Repentance and E for Evangelization**). The cost of the conference is only \$10.00 which includes four speakers on the topics of: Faith, Intercession, Repentance and Evangelization. There is also a youth forum and a young adult forum. Please mark it on your calendars. Last year's event brought in 600 to 700 people. You may register online at www.namcatholicchurch.org.

ON MISSION FOR CHURCH ALIVE PARISH SESSION: I would like to remind everyone that our Parish Session for learning of the initial draft models that the diocese is proposing for *On Mission for the Church Alive* will be held at **St. Michael Church (not St. Michael Hall)** on Tuesday, November 8, 2016 from 7:00 pm to 9:00 pm. Similarly, the same presentation will be given at **North American Martyrs Church (not DeLuca Hall)** on Monday, November 14, 2016 from 7:00 pm to 9:00 pm. **Bishop Zubik wants all presentations to be given in churches before the Blessed Sacrament rather than the presentations be given in church halls.** The two presentations at St. Bernadette Parish will be given at roughly the same time. By November 16, parishioners in both parishes will have had a chance to view these models. There will be a lot of information presented and it will take time to process the information presented.

I would like to have a **Joint Session of the Pastoral and Finance Councils** on Monday, November 21, at DeLuca Hall to hear comments from our councils on the information presented. The six members of our *On Mission for the Church Alive team* will join me to help me answer questions of the Pastoral and Finance Council members. This particular meeting will be for the councils only. I will seek the advice of both the Pastoral and Finance Councils to decide on next steps of whether to have a town hall meeting for our parishioners and if so, when to plan such a meeting to give you a chance to share your comments and to answer your questions as well.

LECTORS NEEDED: For the FIRE Rally New Evangelization for the New Millennium Conference held at the Monroeville Convention Center on Saturday, Nov. 5, there will be a closing Mass celebrated by **Bishop Zubik** at 4:00 pm. Since St. Bernadette Parish is supplying the altar servers, I agreed with Fr. Tony that our parish will supply two lectors. I would prefer two adult or high school lectors. I am asking on a first come, first served basis. The first two lectors who call me at 412-373-0330 ext. 11 and leave a message that they would like to read at the bishop's Mass, I will accept. I'll be waiting to hear from you.

In addition, **John Aiken** and I will be hosting a Lector Training Workshop on Saturday, Oct. 29 at 10:00 am at NAM Church. There will be some teens present who have already committed to be trained as a lector. If you are an adult who is interested in being trained as a lector, please contact me at 412-373-0330 ext. 11 so that we made add you to the list of those to be trained.

MASS BOOK TO OPEN

The Mass Book for 2017 will open on Thursday, **October 27** for both NAM & St. Michael. You may come in person to NAM from 10:00 AM-12:00 Noon and 2:00-4:00 PM. Beginning Monday, **October 31** you may phone for Masses to be said at either church at 412-373-0330 X 10. No Masses will be taken Friday, **October 28**. The guidelines will be the same as last year; that is, four Masses may be said during the year for the same intention. Only one of them may be on Saturday or Sunday. At the present time, we have a small surplus of Masses which would be sent to retired priests or mission priests who are in need of Mass Intentions only if that surplus increased dramatically.

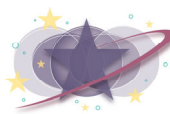

NEIGHBORHOOD 2, ST. RENE GOUPIL

NEIGHBORHOOD 3, ST. JEAN DE LALANDE

Team Leader: Marty Galia, 412-380-4681.

NEIGHBORHOOD 4, ST. JEAN DE BREBEUF

St. John de Brebeuf was one of the first Jesuit missionaries to reach Canada. He was a hardy frontiersman and established the first mission in 1625 near Lake Ontario. He was the first of the martyrs to be killed while preaching Christianity. In 1649, the Iroquois captured the Huron village of Saint Ignatius and he was killed. His courage was admired by the young native Americans.

NEIGHBORHOOD 5, ST. CHARLES GARNIER

St. Charles Garnier arrived in Canada in 1636. He, like the other martyrs, preached the faith to the Native Americans. He did much of his work in the Ossernenon village. In 1649, while working with a group of followers, he was killed by the Iroquois.

NEIGHBORHOOD 6, ST. GABRIEL LALEMANT

St. Gabriel Lalemant arrived in 1648 at Fort St. Mary in Canada. In 1649 he joined Fr. Brebeuf at St. Ignatius. They worked at the mission there attempting to convert the Native Americans to Christianity. The mission was captured by the Iroquois tribe and he was taken prisoner and killed.

NEIGHBORHOOD 7, ST. ANTOINE DANIEL

St. Antoine Daniel came to see and stay in Canada in 1632. He preached Christianity to the Native Americans and started the school of our Lady of Angels in Quebec for Native American boys. Many of the Native Americans disliked the idea of their young boys being taught Christianity and the idea of a peaceful existence. One day in 1648 while he was saying Mass in his frontier chapel he was killed.

NEIGHBORHOOD 8, ST. NOEL CHABANEL

St. Noel Chabanel came to Canada in 1643. He worked for 6 years among the Algonquin near Fort St. Mary. He disliked the cruel customs and tried to teach and show the Native Americans the Christian way. In 1649, he was killed out of hatred for the faith he was teaching to the Huron Indians.
