**DOOR-TO-DOOR EVANGELISTS COMMISSIONED, PRAYER FOR THE CONVERSION OF SINNERS,
PARISH MEETING ON MISSION FOR CHURCH ALIVE, HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION,
EVANGELIZATION CONFERENCE, GENEROUS GIFT**

DOOR-TO-DOOR EVANGELISTS COMMISSIONED: This past weekend I had the privilege of commissioning ten door-to-door evangelists who will join me in going door-to-door in Neighborhood One which follows Haymaker Road and the intersecting streets all the way down to Haymaker Village. This is the most densely populated neighborhood of our parish with 791 families living in this area. Some of our teams of two have already begun. One more team may be commissioned this week bringing our total number of teams to six (with one alternate). Our goal (as stated in our Parish Pastoral Plan 2016) is to bring the love of Christ to all those we meet. For those who are already parishioners, this is an opportunity to update your census information as well as assessing your needs so that our parish can assist you better. Our teams are trained at listening, offering to pray with you for special intentions and to offer you free brochures, DVD's and Miraculous Medals as needed. They will also be going to non-Catholic and non-Christian households to help connect them with whatever house of worship they are affiliated. If the person we are visiting asks about our church, we are prepared to share with them our faith story, give them a prayer card with Mass times and give them a bulletin. This will be a very long but hopefully, very fruitful process. We rely upon your prayers for our teams as well as those we are visiting. We will be wearing badges that say "NAM Parish" that bears a cross and hands clasped. I have also filed applications for each of us in the Municipality of Monroeville for a solicitation permit that lasts one year and can be renewed each year.

PRAYER FOR THE CONVERSION OF SINNERS: As I said in my homily last weekend, here is the prayer that I used to close my homily. I hope that you are as inspired by it as I am. It is a prayer that I pray each morning.

Prayer for the Conversion of Sinners

Our Lady has asked for the conversion of sinners through prayer. Say this prayer daily for the conversion of sinners: one sinner per day, 365 sinners per year. Imagine your reward in heaven after each year of prayers.

Lord, I offer to you, this entire day, every breath I take, every pain I feel, every hurt I experience, and all the sadness I suffer.

I also offer to you, all the steps I take, all the joys I feel, all the happiness I experience, and all the successes I enjoy.

I offer all of these in Your Name, for your intercession in the conversion of one sinner this day.

May my pain suffered this day, and happiness experienced this day, save and enlighten one sinner, and bring them back to You, their Father, for their eternal reward in Heaven.

PARISH MEETING ON MISSION FOR CHURCH ALIVE: I would like everyone to come to one of two Parish Meetings for *On Mission for Church Alive*. As has been announced previously, **these meetings will be on Tuesday, November 8 at St. Michael Church, Pitcairn and the same presentation will be given on Monday, November 14 at North American Martyrs Church. The time for each presentation will be from 7:00 pm to 9:00 pm.** These presentations are ongoing throughout the diocese. Each presentation will be led by a Diocesan representative, a representative from Catholic Leadership Institute as well as myself. It will be a power point presentation with time to ask questions at the end. It is important to remember that these are **First Draft Models which will be modified.** The purpose of the presentation is to reveal this to parishioners to get your feedback on the models proposed. **Every parish of the diocese will be affected by these models. It is important that you come to one of the presentations.**

HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION: This Tuesday is All Saints Day, a Holy Day of Obligation. It is considered a serious sin if one misses a holy day of obligation for reasons other than: sickness, illness, necessary work eg. a doctor on-call, lack of transportation or an emergency. We are offering four different Mass times (one on Monday night and three on Tuesday). Check the bulletin for the Mass times that best suit you.

EVANGELIZATION CONFERENCE: *The New Evangelization for the New Millennium Conference* will be held at the Monroeville Convention Center on Saturday, November 5, from 1:00 pm to 5:30 pm with the 4:30 pm Mass celebrated by **Bishop David Zubik**. It will follow the format of a FIRE Rally (standing for **F for Faith, I for Intercession, R for Repentance and E for Evangelization**). The cost of the conference is only \$10.00 which includes four speakers on the topics of: Faith, Intercession, Repentance and Evangelization. There is also a youth forum and a young adult forum. GENEROUS GIFT: One of our parishioners, **Jane Schubert**, was an elderly single woman who lived at Broadview Manor High Rise, Pitcairn. You may know that I celebrate Mass at Broadview Manor on the second Wednesday of each month. I would mostly see Jane at that Mass. Sometimes Jane would get a ride to attend Masses at St. Michael Church for Sunday Mass and often, at daily Mass. Jane died on December 16, 2015. She was buried at Good Shepherd Church, North Braddock. Today I received in the mail two checks from the Estate of Jane Schubert. One was for North American Martyrs Church for \$5,000. The other was for St. Michael Church for \$5,000. It was quite a surprise to receive \$10,000 for our parish. This amount is equivalent to one weekend collection of all four Masses combined. Please pray for the soul of Jane Schubert. May she rest in peace with our Risen Savior.

NEIGHBORHOOD 4, ST. JEAN DE BREBEUF

St. John de Brebeuf was one of the first Jesuit missionaries to reach Canada. He was a hardy frontiersman and established the first mission in 1625 near Lake Ontario. He was the first of the martyrs to be killed while preaching Christianity. In 1649, the Iroquois captured the Huron village of Saint Ignatius and he was killed. His courage was admired by the young native Americans.

NEIGHBORHOOD 5, ST. CHARLES GARNIER

St. Charles Garnier arrived in Canada in 1636. He, like the other martyrs, preached the faith to the Native Americans. He did much of his work in the Ossernenon village. In 1649, while working with a group of followers, he was killed by the Iroquois.

NEIGHBORHOOD 6, ST. GABRIEL LALEMANT

St. Gabriel Lalemant arrived in 1648 at Fort St. Mary in Canada. In 1649 he joined Fr. Brebeuf at St. Ignatius. They worked at the mission there attempting to convert the Native Americans to Christianity. The mission was captured by the Iroquois tribe and he was taken prisoner and killed.

NEIGHBORHOOD 7, ST. ANTOINE DANIEL

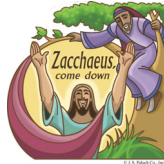
St. Antoine Daniel came to see and stay in Canada in 1632. He preached Christianity to the Native Americans and started the school of our Lady of Angels in Quebec for Native American boys. Many of the Native Americans disliked the idea of their young boys being taught Christianity and the idea of a peaceful existence. One day in 1648 while he was saying Mass in his frontier chapel he was killed.

NEIGHBORHOOD 8, ST. NOEL CHABANEL

St. Noel Chabanel came to Canada in 1643. He worked for 6 years among the Algonquin near Fort St. Mary. He disliked the cruel customs and tried to teach and show the Native Americans the Christian way. In 1649, he was killed out of hatred for the faith he was teaching to the Huron Indians.
