***ON MISSION PARISH PRESENTATION:*** The second (and final) presentation of the First Draft Models to our parish for *On Mission for the Church Alive* will be held on Monday, November 14, at North American Martyrs Church, at 7:00 pm to 9:00 pm. If you did not attend the presentation last week at St. Michael Church on November 8, then I urge you to attend the meeting on November 14 at North American Martyrs Church. As I have said before, “Bishop Zubik says that every parish of the diocese will be affected by *On Mission for the Church Alive*”. The bishop wants your feedback as I do. Even if you never attended a church meeting before, it’s important that you attend this one. I hope to see you on Monday.

***INFANT JESUS RESPECT LIFE MEETING:*** There will be an Infant Jesus Respect Life Meeting on Tuesday, November 15, at 7:00 pm at the St. Bernadette Rectory Conference Room. All are welcome to attend including new members who are looking to becoming more involved in learning about how we can better respect life from conception to natural death.

***FOR THOSE WHO HAVE OFFERED A MASS INTENTION:*** For those who have offered a Mass intention who happen to be at that Mass, it is always a good idea to identify yourselves to the ushers before Mass telling them that you would like to bring up the Offertory gifts after the Prayers of the Faithful. Often times the ushers are looking for people to bring up the gifts but no one comes forward. It’s up to you to tell them that you are the ones who offered the Mass and would like to present the Offertory gifts otherwise the ushers will pick someone else.

***LIFE CARE CLOSING:*** The little hospital on McGinley Road down the hill from Forbes Hospital and before you get to Woodhaven will be closing at the beginning of December according to Fr. Joe Beck, the priest chaplain of Life Care. Father Joe told me that they were down to 12 patients and could not remain operational. I suppose that it’s a sign of the times when the smaller hospitals simply cannot compete with the larger hospitals such as Forbes Regional Hospital and UPMC East. We will miss having our neighbor, Life Care, down the road.

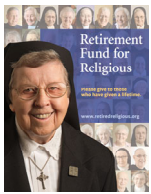
***CHANGES IN THE RITE OF MATRIMONY:*** At the Oglebay Convocation of priests in September, I attended a workshop by the Worship Director of the diocese, **Fr. Jim Gretz**, on the revised Sacrament of Matrimony. One of his observations was the change in the Entrance Rite of the Wedding Mass. The New Rite emphasizes the importance of **both the father and the mother, as parents of the bride and parents of the groom who would be part of the opening procession led by a cross bearer**. In the past, most of the attention was paid to the bride and her father who walked her down the aisle. While not minimizing the importance of the bride and her father, the new rite is more inclusive so that the bride’s mother and the groom and his parents are part of the procession as well. Presumably, the bridesmaids and groomsmen will be after the crossbearer and before the groom and his parents, the best man and maid of honor, followed by the bride and her parents. The penitential rite is omitted from the wedding and the Gloria then follows. The New Rite of Matrimony goes into effect in the United States effective Dec. 31, 2016.

***MIM THANKSGIVING SERVICE:*** The annual **Monroeville Interfaith Ministerium Thanksgiving Service** will take place on Monday, November 21 at 7:00 pm at the Hindu Jain Temple (off of Route 22 if you turn at Levin Furniture). Since half of the members of the Monroeville Interfaith Ministerium are not Christian, this is an opportunity to learn about how different members of our community give thanks to God, in our melting pot nation, considering that different houses of worship have different conceptions of God. In our own community there are members of: Hindu, Buddhist, Sikh, Jewish, Islam and Universalist religions besides those who are: Catholic, Presbyterian, Lutheran, Methodist, etc. Our Pastoral Minister, **Tony Costa**, will represent me with a reading from the New Testament. Members of the St. Bernadette Church Choir will also sing. Food will be served in the Hindu Jain Temple Social Hall after the service. Free tours of the Hindu Temple will be given at 6:00 pm. All are welcome.

I will be unable to attend because of a previous commitment to meet with a **Joint Session of the Pastoral and Finance Councils** on Monday, November 21 at 7:00 at DeLuca Hall. However, I will be the celebrant for our annual Thanksgiving Mass on Thursday, Nov. 24 at 8:00 am at North American Martyrs Church.

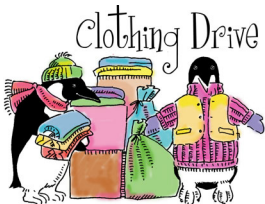

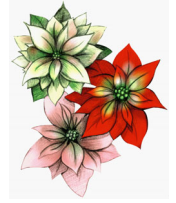

## NEIGHBORHOOD 3, ST. JEAN DE LALANDE

Happy belated 60<sup>th</sup> birthday and Veteran's Day to my good friend, hero, and mentor, "Captain" Mike Castagnero. Mike claims to be the first infant baptized in the current St Michael's Church. Through his military service, he has traveled the world to end up back in Pitcairn. Mike and Kim were married in DeLuca Hall, the original North American Martyr's church. Remember all of our veterans, both living and deceased for their gift of service to our country. ## NEIGHBORHOOD 4, ST. JEAN DE BREBEUF

St. John de Brebeuf was one of the first Jesuit missionaries to reach Canada. He was a hardy frontiersman and established the first mission in 1625 near Lake Ontario. He was the first of the martyrs to be killed while preaching Christianity. In 1649, the Iroquois captured the Huron village of Saint Ignatius and he was killed. His courage was admired by the young native Americans.

## NEIGHBORHOOD 5, ST. CHARLES GARNIER

St. Charles Garnier arrived in Canada in 1636. He, like the other martyrs, preached the faith to the Native Americans. He did much of his work in the Ossernenon village. In 1649, while working with a group of followers, he was killed by the Iroquois.

## NEIGHBORHOOD 6, ST. GABRIEL LALEMANT

St. Gabriel Lalemant arrived in 1648 at Fort St. Mary in Canada. In 1649 he joined Fr. Brebeuf at St. Ignatius. They worked at the mission there attempting to convert the Native Americans to Christianity. The mission was captured by the Iroquois tribe and he was taken prisoner and killed.

## NEIGHBORHOOD 7, ST. ANTOINE DANIEL

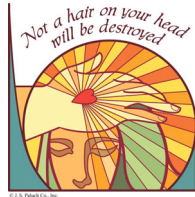
St. Antoine Daniel came to see and stay in Canada in 1632. He preached Christianity to the Native Americans and started the school of our Lady of Angels in Quebec for Native American boys. Many of the Native Americans disliked the idea of their young boys being taught Christianity and the idea of a peaceful existence. One day in 1648 while he was saying Mass in his frontier chapel he was killed.

## NEIGHBORHOOD 8, ST. NOEL CHABANEL

St. Noel Chabanel came to Canada in 1643. He worked for 6 years among the Algonquin near Fort St. Mary. He disliked the cruel customs and tried to teach and show the Native Americans the Christian way. In 1649, he was killed out of hatred for the faith he was teaching to the Huron Indians.
