FILL THE NEED RECAP, FOCUS GROUP SESSIONS, THE WILD GOOSE

FILL THE NEED RECAP: Below is a letter that was e-mailed to me and to other members of the Monroeville Interfaith Ministerium by Rev. Robert J. Marrow, Pastor of Crossroads Presbyterian Church.

Dear Friends,

Cross Roads Presbyterian Church, along with others from the houses of worship that support the Monroeville Interfaith Ministerium, held a Meager Meal Fundraising Event called "Fill the Need." This event was held on Sunday, Jan.15, 2017. For a five dollar donation, each person received what would be a typical soup kitchen meal-a bowl of soup, some bread and water.

Hunger and food insecurity affect individuals and communities everywhere. A large amount of studies have been published in the past several years showing the impact hunger and food insecurity has on people from all walks of life. During the event, we shared information pertaining to hunger and its impact and effect on our community to those in attendance.

A total of \$600.00 was collected during the event. The plan was to provide the food pantries in the Monroeville area with funds to aid in their efforts to fight hunger. The food pantries, as designated by the Monroeville Interfaith Ministerium are:

- 1) The Pitcairn Food Pantry – 30%
- 2) The Garden City United Methodist Church Food Pantry – 30%
- 3) The Cross Roads Presbyterian Church Food Pantry – 30%
- 4) St. Bernadette Roman Catholic Church – 10%

Each of these organizations will receive a check for their portion of the proceeds from this fund-raising event. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

FOCUS GROUP SESSIONS: As part of *On Mission for Church Alive*, diocese has made available resource guides for Focus Group Sessions that will last no longer than one hour which can be used at the discretion of the pastor for his parish between now and March 15. A focus group is a research technique for qualitative data that involves a small group of people (6-10) that share a common set of characteristics (demographics, attitudes, etc.) and participate in a discussion of predetermined topics led by a moderator. After meeting with my *On Mission Team* on Sat. January 14, we had decided collectively to follow the recommendation of the diocese and to offer these sessions. Each focus group will consist of 8-10 people with a facilitator assigned to each group. Three specific questions pertaining to parish life will be asked of each group. There is no one right or wrong answer. A wide range of opinions is welcomed. Everyone will be given a chance to participate in a courteous, respectful manner. A focus group is not: a debate, group therapy, a conflict resolution session, a problem solving session, a promotional opportunity or an educational session. Notes will be taken and feedback forms will be then sent to the diocese.

These sessions will be offered as follows: **Sunday, January 29 after the 9:30 Mass at St. Michael Hall, on Wednesday, February 8 for an afternoon session of 1:15-2:15 (at DeLuca Hall) and for an evening session of 7:00 to 8:15 (at DeLuca Hall). Finally, there will be another evening session on Tuesday, February 28 from 7:00-9:00 (at DeLuca Hall.) Please call either Charlotte or Pat to let her know that you're coming to a session so that we know how many chairs to set up and how many facilitators we'll need. All are welcome.**

THE WILD GOOSE: A friend of mine, **Fr. Dave Pivonka, TOR**, has composed a series of 14 talks on DVD that are part of the Wild Goose series which is subtitled, *Discovering a Deeper Relationship with the Holy Spirit*. Each segment is 26 minutes long. There are also key Scriptural texts, three discussion questions and a reflection. **This will be part of our Adult Education/Continuing Formation in our parish as set forth in our Parish Pastoral Plan.** They will be part of our prayer meetings on the first and third Mondays of each month at St. Michael Hall. **The first lesson will begin on the first Monday in February, which is February 6 at 7:00 pm to 8:30 pm.** Since each participant is asked to have a journal which is designed for the course, the cost is \$10.00 for each journal which is a one-time fee. At this point I have requests to purchase 15 journals and I'm going to purchase an additional five journals just in case. Please call the rectory to sign up for this course with your name, phone # and e-mail if you have one. The course will be twice per month until and including August 21 which is the last segment. Even if you cannot be there for each of the 14 segments, it would be worth your while to sign up for the course. All who attend will have a deeper understanding and appreciation of the Holy Spirit in their lives.

LIBERATION AND REFORM

While you might have to reach for an atlas to determine that Isaiah is speaking about Galilee, today's first reading (part of which was read at Christmas) is prophetic of Jesus' future ministry in that province. The light that brings salvation and rejoicing is, ultimately, Christ. Liberation is the theme: liberation from both ignorance ("darkness") and sin (the "yoke"). As Isaiah identifies a place, so Paul describes an attitude: the attitude that develops, even among good people, of equating their own will with the common good. This always brings dissension, and so it has done in Corinth. Paul will not allow this; we are all members of "Christ's party." The gospel is not to divide us. Matthew quotes from Isaiah in today's Gospel, presenting Jesus as the fulfillment of Isaiah's prophecies. The theme is "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand" (Matthew 4:17). To spread this message, Jesus begins to select disciples, four of whom we meet today: Peter, Andrew, James, and John.

HOUSEKEEPING NOTES

. . . When the weather turns nasty, please remember to listen to the school One-Call system and your local news casts on TV and radio, and to please refrain from calling the school or church to ask if school or CCD has been canceled. Thank you!

. . . If you have attended here for any length of time and consider this your parish, we would like you to know that in order to become a member, you must register. Those who have grown up in the parish and who are now adults must also register. Unless you are receiving envelopes each month or unless you are a registered on-line giver, you cannot receive a tax statement of your donations, nor be eligible for a sponsor's certificate for baptism, confirmation or as a witness to a wedding. To avoid disappointment, fill out the coupon on page 7 in the bulletin or call the secretary at either church to ask for a membership package.

. . . Parking is NOT permitted anywhere except in designated spaces between painted white lines. There is more than adequate parking available for every Mass except perhaps for Easter and Christmas. First-time violators will be issued a warning. Repeat offenders may be subjected to legal consequences.

. . . Please do not close your envelopes with tape or staples. The moneycounters have a big job to do every Monday morning and must do it within the morning hours in order to free up the conference room for other parish business. Staples and tape only slow up this process. By the same token, not folding the paper money is a huge time-saver.

NEIGHBORHOOD 4, ST. JEAN DE BREBEUF

St. John de Brebeuf was one of the first Jesuit missionaries to reach Canada. He was a hardy frontiersman and established the first mission in 1625 near Lake Ontario. He was the first of the martyrs to be killed while preaching Christianity. In 1649, the Iroquois captured the Huron village of Saint Ignatius and he was killed. His courage was admired by the young native Americans.

NEIGHBORHOOD 5, ST. CHARLES GARNIER

St. Charles Garnier arrived in Canada in 1636. He, like the other martyrs, preached the faith to the Native Americans. He did much of his work in the Ossernenon village. In 1649, while working with a group of followers, he was killed by the Iroquois.

NEIGHBORHOOD 6, ST. GABRIEL LALEMANT

St. Gabriel Lalemant arrived in 1648 at Fort St. Mary in Canada. In 1649 he joined Fr. Brebeuf at St. Ignatius. They worked at the mission there attempting to convert the Native Americans to Christianity. The mission was captured by the Iroquois tribe and he was taken prisoner and killed.

NEIGHBORHOOD 7, ST. ANTOINE DANIEL

St. Antoine Daniel came to see and stay in Canada in 1632. He preached Christianity to the Native Americans and started the school of our Lady of Angels in Quebec for Native American boys. Many of the Native Americans disliked the idea of their young boys being taught Christianity and the idea of a peaceful existence. One day in 1648 while he was saying Mass in his frontier chapel he was killed.

NEIGHBORHOOD 8, ST. NOEL CHABANEL

St. Noel Chabanel came to Canada in 1643. He worked for 6 years among the Algonquin near Fort St. Mary. He disliked the cruel customs and tried to teach and show the Native Americans the Christian way. In 1649, he was killed out of hatred for the faith he was teaching to the Huron Indians.
