LETTER FROM DIRECTOR OF CROSSROADS FOOD PANTRY, FOCUS GROUPS, WILD GOOSE SERIES, DEFENDING THE FAITH, HEALING MASS, LENTEN MORNING OF REFLECTION

LETTER FROM DIRECTOR OF CROSSROADS FOOD PANTRY: I received the following letter from **Peg Sinback**, the Director of Cross Roads Food Pantry on January 14th and wanted to share it with you.

Dear Reverend Luisi and congregants,

From the frequent food donations, the financial support, and participation in our 4th Wiseman gift program, we are grateful for your continued support through this past year. Without such help, we would not be able to maintain this mission work. Some of the faces of our clients change throughout the year as their life situations change. However, the scope of need continues to rise. The number of families we have assisted this year has risen 11% from last year, and 82% over the past 8 years. It is astounding to us, how much need there is in our community. Thank you again and Blessings to all of you,

FOCUS GROUPS: As part of *On Mission for Church Alive*, diocese has made available resource guides for Focus Group Sessions that will last no longer than one hour which can be used at the discretion of the pastor for his parish between now and March 15. A focus group is a research technique for qualitative data that involves a small group of people (6-10) that share a common set of characteristics (demographics, attitudes, etc.) and participate in a discussion of predetermined topics led by a moderator. After meeting with my *On Mission Team* on Sat. January 14, we had decided collectively to follow the recommendation of the diocese and to offer these sessions. Each focus group will consist of 8-10 people with a facilitator assigned to each group. Three specific questions pertaining to parish life will be asked of each group. There is no one right or wrong answer. A wide range of opinions is welcomed. Everyone will be given a chance to participate in a courteous, respectful manner. A focus group is not: a debate, group therapy, a conflict resolution session, a problem solving session, a promotional opportunity or an educational session. Notes will be taken and feedback forms will be then sent to the diocese. **So far, some people have signed up but not many. Notice that there is one morning session, one afternoon session and two evening sessions. Please call one of our parish secretaries so that we know how many people to expect. For those attending a focus group session, in order to be prepared to actively participate, I would recommend that you go to www.diopitt.org and click on the link for *On Mission for Church Alive*. We are listed as Vicariate Two, District One.**

These sessions will be offered as follows: **Sunday, February 5 after the 9:30 Mass at St. Michael Hall, on Wednesday, February 8 for an afternoon session of 1:15-2:15 (at DeLuca Hall) and for an evening session of 7:00 to 8:15 (at DeLuca Hall). Finally, there will be another evening session on Tuesday, February 28 from 7:00-9:00 (at DeLuca Hall.) Please call either Charlotte or Pat to let her know that you're coming to a session so that we know how many chairs to set up and how many facilitators we'll need. All are welcome.**

WILD GOOSE SERIES: A friend of mine, **Fr. Dave Pivonka, TOR**, has composed a series of 14 talks on DVD that are part of the Wild Goose series which is subtitled, *Discovering a Deeper Relationship with the Holy Spirit*. Each segment is 26 minutes long. There are also key Scriptural texts, three discussion questions and a reflection. **This will be part of our Adult Education/ Continuing Formation in our parish as set forth in our Parish Pastoral Plan.** They will be part of our prayer meetings on the first and third Mondays of each month at St. Michael Hall. **The first lesson will begin on the first Monday in February, which is February 6 at 7:00 pm to 9:00 pm. I have extended the time so that we have time to pray after the faith-sharing part of the meeting. So far 30 people have signed up! This means I will be ordering more journals.** Since each participant is asked to have a journal which is designed for the course, the cost is \$10.00 for each journal which is a one-time fee. At this point I have requests to purchase 15 journals and I'm going to purchase an additional five journals just in case. Please call the rectory to sign up for this course with your name, phone # and e-mail if you have one. The course will be twice per month until and including August 21 which is the last segment. Even if you cannot be there for each of the 14 segments, it would be worth your while to sign up for the course. All who attend will have a deeper understanding and appreciation of the Holy Spirit in their lives.

DEFENDING THE FAITH: As part of our Continuing Education in Adult Formation, **Vanda Raszewski** had in previous years brought us a series on Catholic Apologetics. Apologetics means "Defending the Faith." We also had the DVD series entitled *Catholicism* by Fr. Robert Barron that was viewed by some. Now **Tony Costa**, our Pastoral Minister, would like to lead his own Catholic Apologetics series with anyone who would like to attend. This will be an ongoing series beginning on Monday, February 13 at 6:30 pm to 8:00 pm at St. Michael Hall. This will typically take place on the second and fourth Monday of each month at St. Michael Hall. There is no cost. The course will explore Sacred Scripture and the Church's Tradition as ways to learn the faith and to defend it in the company of those who misunderstand and distort the Catholic faith. There is no sign-up. Come with an open mind and a willing spirit!

HEALING MASS: There will be a Fraternity of Priest Healing Mass at St. Robert Bellarmine Church, East McKeesport on Wednesday, February 15 at 7:00 pm. All are welcome!

LENTEN MORNING OF REFLECTION: There is an invitation for parish staffs, parish leaders and all parishioners to gather for prayer and reflection on Saturday, March 4, 2017 from 9:00 am to Noon at 10 locations throughout the diocese – to be determined. Registrations will be conducted online. NEIGHBORHOOD 3, ST. JEAN DE LALANDE

As a follow-up to last Sunday's Gospel reading of the Beatitudes, I found a similar passage associated with Saint Teresa of Calcutta: People are often unreasonable, irrational, and self-centered. Forgive them anyway. If you are kind, people may accuse you of selfish, ulterior motives. Be kind anyway. If you are successful, you will win some unfaithful friends and some genuine enemies. Succeed anyway. If you are honest and sincere people may deceive you. Be honest and sincere anyway. What you spend years creating, others could destroy overnight. Create anyway. If you find serenity and happiness, some may be jealous. Be happy anyway. The good you do today, will often be forgotten. Do good anyway. Give the best you have, and it will never be enough. Give your best anyway. In the final analysis, it is between you and God. It was never between you and them anyway. NEIGHBORHOOD 4, ST. JEAN DE BREBEUF

St. John de Brebeuf was one of the first Jesuit missionaries to reach Canada. He was a hardy frontiersman and established the first mission in 1625 near Lake Ontario. He was the first of the martyrs to be killed while preaching Christianity. In 1649, the Iroquois captured the Huron village of Saint Ignatius and he was killed. His courage was admired by the young native Americans.

NEIGHBORHOOD 5, ST. CHARLES GARNIER

St. Charles Garnier arrived in Canada in 1636. He, like the other martyrs, preached the faith to the Native Americans. He did much of his work in the Ossernenon village. In 1649, while working with a group of followers, he was killed by the Iroquois.

NEIGHBORHOOD 6, ST. GABRIEL LALEMANT

St. Gabriel Lalemant arrived in 1648 at Fort St. Mary in Canada. In 1649 he joined Fr. Brebeuf at St. Ignatius. They worked at the mission there attempting to convert the Native Americans to Christianity. The mission was captured by the Iroquois tribe and he was taken prisoner and killed.

NEIGHBORHOOD 7, ST. ANTOINE DANIEL

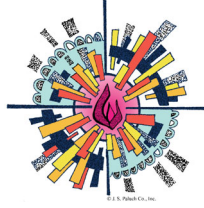
St. Antoine Daniel came to see and stay in Canada in 1632. He preached Christianity to the Native Americans and started the school of our Lady of Angels in Quebec for Native American boys. Many of the Native Americans disliked the idea of their young boys being taught Christianity and the idea of a peaceful existence. One day in 1648 while he was saying Mass in his frontier chapel he was killed.

NEIGHBORHOOD 8, ST. NOEL CHABANEL

St. Noel Chabanel came to Canada in 1643. He worked for 6 years among the Algonquin near Fort St. Mary. He disliked the cruel customs and tried to teach and show the Native Americans the Christian way. In 1649, he was killed out of hatred for the faith he was teaching to the Huron Indians.
