*CHILD GREETERS? MANDATED REPORTER TRAINING, EUCHARISTIC ADORATION,
DEFENDING THE FAITH, HEALING MASS, BETTER TOGETHER*



CHILD GREETERS?: At our Pastoral Council Meeting on Tuesday, February 7, I brought up the idea of having child/teen greeters in our church vestibules on a rotating basis. I explained that any minor must be accompanied by a parent. When the council asked me how young a child can be to be a greeter, I responded, “I think that a smiling three-year old saying ‘Good morning! Welcome to North American Martyrs Church can really brighten someone’s day!’” Besides, Scripture says, “with a little child to guide them.” (Isiah 11:6) The Pastoral Council enthusiastically endorsed having child greeters accompanied by a parent. If you and your child are interested in being part of this ministry, then you should attend the meeting for ushers and greeters on Saturday, February 25 at 9:30 am at DeLuca Hall and will last until 11:00. The session is for those who are currently ushers and greeters as well as those who want to be part of this ministry. The session will review the proper protocol for all ushers and greeters as Ministers of Hospitality as well as training for AED (Automatic External Defibrillator).

In addition, I ask that those children, teens and parents who want to be part of this ministry to please call **Charlotte Dobrinsky** (NAM Parish Secretary) to schedule at which Masses you would like to be greeter. For convenience sake, it’s probably better to sign up for either the first, second, third, fourth or fifth Sunday of the month at the 8:00 am Mass (for example) which would rotate to be that Sunday every month instead of having to call the secretary each month. Remember also, that there are at least three places where people enter NAM church i.e. the main vestibule, the side door (near the parish office) and the entrance through the school by the organ. In effect, we could have greeters at all three entrances. If you wish to be a greeter at St. Michael Church for the 9:30 am Mass, then call **Pat Cepec** (St. Michael Parish Secretary). There is only one entrance for St. Michael Church so one greeter would suffice. **Rege Accornero** already does a great job as greeter at St. Michael Church but I’m sure that a parent-child combination to assist him would be fine by him!

MANDATED REPORTER TRAINING: Some Pastoral Council members mentioned some confusion regarding who is required to complete Mandated Reporter Training (MRT) and what it all entails. To that end, I have asked our Safe Environment Coordinator, **Donna Lew-Buechel**, to put an insert in next week’s bulletin about MRT. In short, it is an on-line 3 hour course which must be completed by any parish staff or volunteers, who have direct contact with children. This course is required and mandated by the State of Pennsylvania in light of the Jerry Sandusky case. This is different than the Protecting God’s Children Course that many of you have already completed. More information will be on the flyer in next week’s bulletin.

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION: Monday, February 13, is our monthly parish Eucharistic Day. I will expose the Blessed Sacrament after the 8:00 am Mass and the church will remain open all day concluding with a holy hour from 7:00 pm to 8:00 pm. Please come during part of your day to adore Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.

DEFENDING THE FAITH: As part of our Continuing Education in Adult Formation, **Vanda Raszewski** had in previous years brought us a series on Catholic Apologetics. Apologetics means “Defending the Faith.” We also had the DVD series entitled Catholicism by Fr. Robert Barron that was viewed by some. Now **Tony Costa**, our Pastoral Minister, would like to lead his own Catholic Apologetics series with anyone who would like to attend. This will be an ongoing series beginning on Monday, February 13 at 6:30 pm to 8:00 pm at St. Michael Hall. This will typically take place on the second and fourth Monday of each month at St. Michael Hall. There is no cost. The course will explore Sacred Scripture and the Church’s Tradition as ways to learn the faith and to defend it in the company of those who misunderstand and distort the Catholic faith. There is no sign-up. Come with an open mind and a willing spirit!

HEALING MASS: There will be a Fraternity of Priest Healing Mass at St. Robert Bellarmine Church, East McKeesport on Wednesday, February 15 at 7:00 pm. All are welcome!

BETTER TOGETHER: On this World Marriage Sunday, I wanted all engaged couples and married couples to be aware of a FREE questionnaire designed to spark incredible conversations between couples. Called, “Better Together” this is sponsored by Dynamic Catholic. They have collaborated with leading Catholic psychologist Dr. Gregory Bottaro to develop the Better Together Inventory. While it is designed as a tool to help couples prepare for marriage, I think it would be helpful for any couple to take the inventory to see how compatible they are. It is easy to implement. ON MISSION FOR CHURCH ALIVE!

DO YOU REMEMBER YOUR BAPTISM? From its earliest days, the Church has seen Lent as a time to remember our baptism. On that day each of us became a member of the **Body of Christ**. St. Paul reminds us that in baptism we share a common bond with all other Christians. In 1 Corinthians 12:12-13, 25 he writes, "As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ. For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, slaves or free persons, and we were all given to drink of one Spirit . . . there should be no division in the body but . . . its parts should have equal concern for each other." The 40 days of Lent are a time to **remember our baptism** and consider the meaning of our lives and how together we can better follow Jesus as members of His Body.

NEIGHBORHOOD 3, ST. JEAN DE LALANDE

NEIGHBORHOOD 4, ST. JEAN DE BREBEUF

St. John de Brebeuf was one of the first Jesuit missionaries to reach Canada. He was a hardy frontiersman and established the first mission in 1625 near Lake Ontario. He was the first of the martyrs to be killed while preaching Christianity. In 1649, the Iroquois captured the Huron village of Saint Ignatius and he was killed. His courage was admired by the young native Americans.

NEIGHBORHOOD 5, ST. CHARLES GARNIER

St. Charles Garnier arrived in Canada in 1636. He, like the other martyrs, preached the faith to the Native Americans. He did much of his work in the Ossernenon village. In 1649, while working with a group of followers, he was killed by the Iroquois.

NEIGHBORHOOD 6, ST. GABRIEL LALEMANT

St. Gabriel Lalemant arrived in 1648 at Fort St. Mary in Canada. In 1649 he joined Fr. Brebeuf at St. Ignatius. They worked at the mission there attempting to convert the Native Americans to Christianity. The mission was captured by the Iroquois tribe and he was taken prisoner and killed.

NEIGHBORHOOD 7, ST. ANTOINE DANIEL

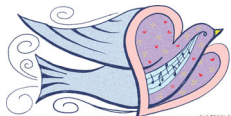
St. Antoine Daniel came to see and stay in Canada in 1632. He preached Christianity to the Native Americans and started the school of our Lady of Angels in Quebec for Native American boys. Many of the Native Americans disliked the idea of their young boys being taught Christianity and the idea of a peaceful existence. One day in 1648 while he was saying Mass in his frontier chapel he was killed.

NEIGHBORHOOD 8, ST. NOEL CHABANEL

St. Noel Chabanel came to Canada in 1643. He worked for 6 years among the Algonquin near Fort St. Mary. He disliked the cruel customs and tried to teach and show the Native Americans the Christian way. In 1649, he was killed out of hatred for the faith he was teaching to the Huron Indians.
