URGENT! POTHOLE REPAIR, PENTECOST SACRED ARTS FESTIVAL, RADIO ROSARY

URGENT! It is urgent for each of our parishioners to complete the feedback form which was an insert in last week's bulletin regarding your response to the Parish Groupings proposed by the diocese. As I reported in my Pastor's Page in last week's bulletin, we are currently grouped with St. Bernadette, (Monroeville), St. Bartholomew, (Penn Hills), St. Gerard Majella, (Penn Hills) and St. Susanna, (Penn Hills). No one from our parish or St. Bernadette parish or St. Gerard Majella Parish or St. Susanna Parish asked for this grouping. We feel that the diocese either did not listen to us with our initial feedback or they don't care.

The good news is that each parish of the diocese has a chance to appeal this possible grouping with an alternative model. Also in your bulletin last weekend were two double-side sheets that contain four options. The grouping that the diocese has proposed is Option 1. We are proposing Option 2 which groups together the three Penn Hills Parishes along with St. Joseph, (Verona) and St. Irenaeus, (Oakmont) which would be Group A. This makes more sense geographically and socio-economically. Besides, these parishes are in the same district and have been clustered together for the last ten years. Option 2 would allow St. Bernadette Parish and North American Martyrs Parish to be grouped together in Group B. This would also group together St. Januarius, (Plum), St. John the Baptist (Plum) and Our Lady of Joy (Holiday Park) in Group C. **If you need the options sheet and the feedback form, stop in the office.**

The diocese will only receive one response per parish submitted electronically by the deadline of June 1. I would like you to submit your completed feedback forms to either one of our parish offices as soon as possible. Perhaps you have already put your feedback form in the collection basket at Mass this weekend. Since the parish offices are closed on Memorial Day, My *On Mission* team and I will be collecting, collating and summarizing all of your feedback on May 30 **after** the St. Anthony Novena Mass which begins at 7:00 pm at St. Michael Church. My team and I will meet at St. Michael Hall at 7:45 pm.

It's important to note that if I don't get a lot of feedback from you for Option 2, then the diocese will assume that you are OK with Option 1. If Option 1 goes through, namely, the grouping of North American Martyrs Parish with St. Bernadette Parish and the Penn Hills Parishes then we may be forced to close our campus as early as September of 2019. By choosing Option B allows our parish to stay open longer.

POTHOLE REPAIR: The **Quality Asphalt Company** will be patching potholes and resurfacing 40 feet of the alley connecting McGinley Road with our NAM campus by the Outdoor Stations of the Cross on or around the date of June 2 depending on the weather. The potholes were getting deep and the repair is long overdue.

Artwork must be iconographically recognizable and appropriate for liturgical use, public or private devotion. The Exhibit Juror's decision is final regarding the acceptability and selection of works for this exhibition. The Juror is **Rev. Vincent de Paul Crosby O.S.B.** who is a monk at the St. Vincent Archabbey in Latrobe, PA, and an artist who specializes in liturgical vesture. The Statement of Purpose of the Festival is seeking to showcase and foster appreciation of Sacred Artistic expression – by the artists moved by the Spirit and by the faithful who view these works for the purpose of deepening their Christian faith through artistic encounters. 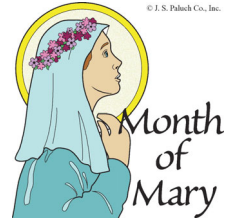
in the town in which you donate it. Please leave your non-perishable food items in the main vestibule of either church. Thank you for your generosity.

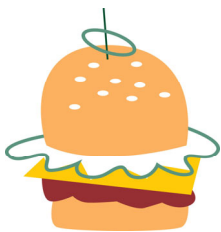

Memorial DAY

NEIGHBORHOOD 4, ST. JEAN DE BREBEUF

St. John de Brebeuf was one of the first Jesuit missionaries to reach Canada. He was a hardy frontiersman and established the first mission in 1625 near Lake Ontario. He was the first of the martyrs to be killed while preaching Christianity. In 1649, the Iroquois captured the Huron village of Saint Ignatius and he was killed. His courage was admired by the young native Americans.

NEIGHBORHOOD 5, ST. CHARLES GARNIER

St. Charles Garnier arrived in Canada in 1636. He, like the other martyrs, preached the faith to the Native Americans. He did much of his work in the Ossernenon village. In 1649, while working with a group of followers, he was killed by the Iroquois.

NEIGHBORHOOD 6, ST. GABRIEL LALEMANT

St. Gabriel Lalemant arrived in 1648 at Fort St. Mary in Canada. In 1649 he joined Fr. Brebeuf at St. Ignatius. They worked at the mission there attempting to convert the Native Americans to Christianity. The mission was captured by the Iroquois tribe and he was taken prisoner and killed.

NEIGHBORHOOD 7, ST. ANTOINE DANIEL

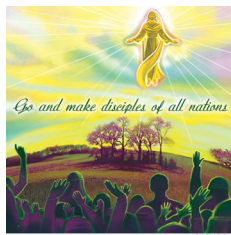
St. Antoine Daniel came to see and stay in Canada in 1632. He preached Christianity to the Native Americans and started the school of our Lady of Angels in Quebec for Native American boys. Many of the Native Americans disliked the idea of their young boys being taught Christianity and the idea of a peaceful existence. One day in 1648 while he was saying Mass in his frontier chapel he was killed.

NEIGHBORHOOD 8, ST. NOEL CHABANEL

St. Noel Chabanel came to Canada in 1643. He worked for 6 years among the Algonquin near Fort St. Mary. He disliked the cruel customs and tried to teach and show the Native Americans the Christian way. In 1649, he was killed out of hatred for the faith he was teaching to the Huron Indians.

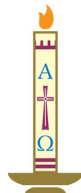
