ST. ANTHONY ITALIAN MASS, NICARAGUA MISSION***

ON MISSION FEEDBACK: Between the Town Hall meeting on May 9 and the responses that we received that were dropped off at the rectory, we received a total of 382 responses, all of which recommended Option 2 which proposes NAM parish to be grouped with St. Bernadette, while the Penn Hills parishes would be grouped with St. Joseph, Verona and St. Irenaeus, Oakmont. Many thanks to our On Mission Team including: **Donna Balcik, Sandy Bonidie, Marty Galia, John Kearns, Jack Marino and Corine Schwartz**, four of whom helped me with tallying the feedback forms and summarizing our response. The diocese extended the deadline for feedback until June 8, so I will delay until next week to give our parish response electronically to the diocese. If you still haven't given your feedback, you have until June 6th to do so. Feedback forms are in the office.

VISITING PRIEST COMING: **Fr. Francis Njoku, CMF** from Nigeria will be arriving to stay with me on Friday, June 9, and staying until the end of July. He is friends **Fr. Cajetan Anyanwu, CMF** who lives at St. Charles Lwanga Parish, Homewood and who has assisted us on different occasions. Please welcome Fr. Francis with your typical warm hospitality.

ST. ANTHONY ITALIAN MASS: The **Feast of St. Anthony of Padua** is on Tuesday, June 13. We will celebrate with our annual Italian Mass at St. Michael Church on June 13 at 7:00 pm. This year's main celebrant will be **Fr. Joe Sioli** who is currently the pastor of St. Louise de Marillac Parish in Upper St. Clair. Fr. Joe can speak Italian fluently but will preach in English. **Fr. Francis Njoku** and I will be concelebrating with Fr. Sioli. Please come and join us for the Mass, the procession with the statue of St. Anthony as we sing hymns along Wall Avenue. We will return for an Italian Festa celebration with lots of delicious Italian food and music. Please come and join us!

NICARAGUA MISSION: Parishioner **Rege Dugan's** grand-daughter is **Helen Bornhorst**. She recently e-mailed me telling me about her Nicaragua Mission trip and her need for funding and prayers. Please read the enclosed letter and support her if you can with your contributions and prayers.

In this past year, I have prayerfully considered a missionary life for the first years after my college graduation from the University of Georgia during May of this year. A few months ago, I decided to accept a job working full time in Nicaragua for Amigos for Christ during the next two years beginning in July.

Amigos for Christ is a non-profit organization committed to serving in various communities in rural Nicaragua. Over the years, Amigos has created clean water and solid sanitation systems, provided preventive, restorative and surgical care to locals, invested in the education of children; and supplied means of economic development. Thousands of missionaries from across the United States travel to Nicaragua each year to serve the community there in this variety of ways.

In addition to doing these direct forms of service work for the community, my job will be connecting the community to American missionaries while working on the spiritual development of the Amigos staff, Nicaraguan community members, and the people who come to serve on mission trips.

Currently, I am seeking financial and spiritual support for my mission. In order to live and serve in Nicaragua for the next two years, I need to fundraise close to \$40,000 in total. The best way to reach this goal is to obtain monthly partners who are committed to donating a specific amount each month. Even as little as \$10/month will help me reach my goal! Any and all contributions and prayers are appreciated!

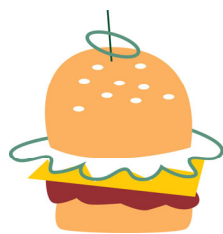

He made a significant impact on a generation of Pitcairn and Monroeville students to grow up and consider staying in their home community to give back to their church and school district. NEIGHBORHOOD 4, ST. JEAN DE BREBEUF

St. John de Brebeuf was one of the first Jesuit missionaries to reach Canada. He was a hardy frontiersman and established the first mission in 1625 near Lake Ontario. He was the first of the martyrs to be killed while preaching Christianity. In 1649, the Iroquois captured the Huron village of Saint Ignatius and he was killed. His courage was admired by the young native Americans.

NEIGHBORHOOD 5, ST. CHARLES GARNIER

St. Charles Garnier arrived in Canada in 1636. He, like the other martyrs, preached the faith to the Native Americans. He did much of his work in the Ossernenon village. In 1649, while working with a group of followers, he was killed by the Iroquois.

NEIGHBORHOOD 6, ST. GABRIEL LALEMANT

St. Gabriel Lalemant arrived in 1648 at Fort St. Mary in Canada. In 1649 he joined Fr. Brebeuf at St. Ignatius. They worked at the mission there attempting to convert the Native Americans to Christianity. The mission was captured by the Iroquois tribe and he was taken prisoner and killed.

NEIGHBORHOOD 7, ST. ANTOINE DANIEL

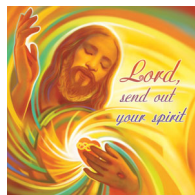
St. Antoine Daniel came to see and stay in Canada in 1632. He preached Christianity to the Native Americans and started the school of our Lady of Angels in Quebec for Native American boys. Many of the Native Americans disliked the idea of their young boys being taught Christianity and the idea of a peaceful existence. One day in 1648 while he was saying Mass in his frontier chapel he was killed.

NEIGHBORHOOD 8, ST. NOEL CHABANEL

St. Noel Chabanel came to Canada in 1643. He worked for 6 years among the Algonquin near Fort St. Mary. He disliked the cruel customs and tried to teach and show the Native Americans the Christian way. In 1649, he was killed out of hatred for the faith he was teaching to the Huron Indians.

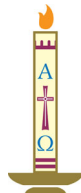
