Dear Parishioners,

In a recent NAM newsletter that was dated May 18, I was speaking about the On Mission for Church Alive groupings of our parish with the parishes of St. Bernadette, Monroeville, St. Bartholomew, Penn Hills, St. Gerard Majella, Penn Hills and St. Suzanna, Penn Hills. Based upon the feedback that you had given me at our parish presentation (which was reported to me in a line-by-line report from the Catholic Leadership Institute) as well as the feedback from the six focus group sessions at which I was present, I thought that I accurately portrayed your concerns with the Penn Hills groupings. However, I used the words “**betrayed by the diocesan officials**” and upon further reflection, I realized that I should have used the word “**misunderstood**” instead of “betrayed”. I have always been passionate about my priestly ministry and I let my passion interfere with the careful selection of words.

Another part of that newsletter which was misleading had to do with the amount of debt that North American Martyrs had accrued with outstanding bills to the parish Insurance and school Insurance. I quoted the number of \$270,000 in the amount we owe (parish and school insurance combined.) This was the number that our business manager, Tim Thorson, had given to me. However, as of May 31, the parish insurance debt is now \$102,074.59 and the school insurance debt is now \$213,167.52 or a total of \$315,242.11. If you factor in the \$61,745.68 loan that we received from the Diocesan Deposit & Loan fund to pay for our insurance debt the **Total Parish Debt is now \$376,987.79.**

Finally, in this same newsletter, I recommended Option 2, namely, the grouping of North American Martyrs Parish with St. Bernadette Parish, Monroeville, while the three Penn Hills parishes would be grouped with St. Joseph Parish, Verona and St. Irenaeus Parish, Oakmont. In this option the three Plum Borough parishes would also be grouped together. Let me clarify why I wrote that.

Fr. Fred Cain, our Regional Vicar, called a meeting for the pastors of the parishes in our district and in the neighboring district to meet on May 8 at 2:00 at St. John the Baptist Parish, Plum. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss openly our thoughts and to try to arrive at consensus. Present also were Fr. Phil Farrell, (Regional Vicar of Vicariate 4), Dr. Linda Lee Ritzer, Secretary of Parish Services, Mr. Bruno Bonacchi, CFO and Secretary for Temporal Affairs and Deacon Kevin Lander, Office of Operations and Information Technology. At this meeting, Mr. Bonacchi distributed to us two double-sided sheets with Options 1-4. He asked us to review these options and to give him feedback on which ones we preferred. (In the interest of transparency, you received these Four Option Sheets as in insert in the May 21 bulletin.) Mr. Bonacchi told the group that he did not favor Option 4 because he didn't think that it was sustainable to group the three Penn Hills parishes by themselves. Option 1 was the proposed diocesan grouping of the Monroeville parishes with the Penn Hills parishes. That left Options 2 and 3. In conferring later with my Business Manager and On Mission Team, they recommended that we support Option 2.

Part of this same meeting involved a discussion about the financial viability of the three Penn Hills parishes. Fr. Ed Wichman, pastor of St. Joseph Parish, Verona, and sacramental minister of St. Bartholomew Parish, Penn Hills said, “Although these parishes are not in debt, they can only afford to keep the lights on.” He noted the high number of elderly in the parish. The Option 4, Group A column indicated a 10 year Mass attendance trend of -6.4% for the Penn Hills parishes. It was for these reasons, that I speculated that these parishes may be declared financially distressed causing them to be put into the one year reorganization category. I surmised that if North American Martyrs Parish and St. Bernadette Parishes were grouped with these churches, then most likely, the number of campuses would be reduced from five to two according to the guidelines of the one year reorganization category. Thinking that the largest campus in Penn Hills is St. Bartholomew Church and the largest campus in Monroeville is St. Bernadette Church, I deduced that North American Martyrs may lose its campus after this one year reorganization, i.e. by September of 2019.

This was speculation on my part which may have caused confusion for you or others outside of the parish. As I have stated before, parishes were given the time to appeal the groupings and the appeal date was extended to June 8. The bishop will then meet with his team and prayerfully discern his decision on the final groupings over the course of many months. He will announce his decision in March of 2018.

I hope that this letter clears up any misunderstanding that I may have caused inadvertently.

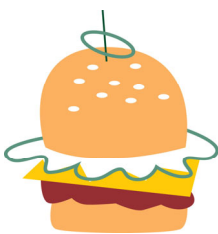

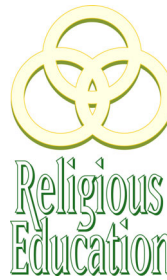

NEIGHBORHOOD 4, ST. JEAN DE BREBEUF

St. John de Brebeuf was one of the first Jesuit missionaries to reach Canada. He was a hardy frontiersman and established the first mission in 1625 near Lake Ontario. He was the first of the martyrs to be killed while preaching Christianity. In 1649, the Iroquois captured the Huron village of Saint Ignatius and he was killed. His courage was admired by the young native Americans.

NEIGHBORHOOD 5, ST. CHARLES GARNIER

St. Charles Garnier arrived in Canada in 1636. He, like the other martyrs, preached the faith to the Native Americans. He did much of his work in the Ossernenon village. In 1649, while working with a group of followers, he was killed by the Iroquois.

NEIGHBORHOOD 6, ST. GABRIEL LALEMANT

St. Gabriel Lalemant arrived in 1648 at Fort St. Mary in Canada. In 1649 he joined Fr. Brebeuf at St. Ignatius. They worked at the mission there attempting to convert the Native Americans to Christianity. The mission was captured by the Iroquois tribe and he was taken prisoner and killed.

NEIGHBORHOOD 7, ST. ANTOINE DANIEL

St. Antoine Daniel came to see and stay in Canada in 1632. He preached Christianity to the Native Americans and started the school of our Lady of Angels in Quebec for Native American boys. Many of the Native Americans disliked the idea of their young boys being taught Christianity and the idea of a peaceful existence. One day in 1648 while he was saying Mass in his frontier chapel he was killed.

NEIGHBORHOOD 8, ST. NOEL CHABANEL

St. Noel Chabanel came to Canada in 1643. He worked for 6 years among the Algonquin near Fort St. Mary. He disliked the cruel customs and tried to teach and show the Native Americans the Christian way. In 1649, he was killed out of hatred for the faith he was teaching to the Huron Indians.
