*As a courtesy to you, I am including a copy of the electronic report that I sent to the diocese by the deadline of June 8 as each of us pastors was requested to do regarding our parish feedback regarding the last Parish Groupings of On Mission for Church Alive. Enclosed is the feedback form that I sent. I want to thank each of you for your feedback, prayers and participation in this process. It's now in the hands of the bishop and his advisors. He will announce his decision for all the parishes next March. In the meantime, let us continue to pray to the Holy Spirit to guide our bishop and his team with their prayerful discernment for the final groupings of parishes in this process.*

4. What are the strengths of the Parish Grouping?

The grouping of the two Monroeville parishes with the three Penn Hills parishes provides the greatest potential capital savings as it minimizes the total number of groups and would allow the closing/sale of the most church buildings. However, it totally neglects the inherent geographic and sociological divisions and was unanimously rejected by all 402 respondents on their feedback forms which included 270 people who attended our Town Hall meeting.

5. Is this Parish Grouping the best relationship of parishes? Why or why not?

In the initial feedback from North American Martyrs Parish after the parish power point presentation and our six focus groups, our Mission Team and parishioners soundly rejected any grouping between the Monroeville parishes and the Plum Borough parishes for reasons of: driving distance, minimal relationship with parishes, different school district, etc. The grouping of the Monroeville parishes with the Penn Hills parishes is worse and fails to fulfill all of the 21 criteria established by the diocese, especially criteria numbers 1, 4, 5, 6, 10, 11 and 12. Even Fr. George Dalton said that the Monroeville/Penn Hills grouping “is cobbled and gerrymandered.” Our parishioners would say it's contrived and foreign. North American Martyrs Parish does not border any of the three Penn Hills parishes. Many parishes in the Diocese of Greensburg are closer to our parishioners than the Penn Hills parishes. I cite as examples the driving distance to various Catholic churches from North American Martyrs Church: St. Regis, Trafford (2.4 miles), Mother of Sorrows, Murrysville (6.8 miles) Immaculate Conception, Irwin (9.1 miles), St. Barbara, Harrison City (9.3 miles), St. Bartholomew, Penn Hills (10 miles). Many parishioners on their feedback forms said that they would go to churches in the Greensburg Diocese or to a non-denominational church rather than going to the Penn Hills parishes. Instead of the bishop's projection of a 25% gain of parishioners, we project a 25 to 50% loss of parishioners if the current diocesan grouping is finalized.

6. What alternative would you propose to make the grouping better?

The best grouping is between St. Bernadette Parish and North American Martyrs Parish in which the 21 criteria established by the diocese are fulfilled. If the Penn Hills parishes need a financial lifeline then they should be grouped with St. Joseph, Verona and St. Irenaeus, Oakmont with whom they have been grouped for 10 years (same district). To say as some have suggested that the parishes should follow the confines of the river is absurd. Nobody takes a boat to Mass.

6. What alternative would you propose to make the grouping better?

The best grouping is between St. Bernadette Parish and North American Martyrs Parish in which the 21 criteria established by the diocese are fulfilled. If the Penn Hills parishes need a financial lifeline then they should be grouped with St. Joseph, Verona and St. Irenaeus, Oakmont with whom they have been grouped for 10 years (same district). To say as some have suggested that the parishes should follow the confines of the river is absurd. Nobody takes a boat to Mass.

St. Bernadette Parish is already carrying a debt over a million dollars. North American Martyrs Parish can help it by: providing additional seating capacity for crowded Masses, by providing more accessible parking, by providing room for expansion with our 25 acres whereas St. Bernadette Parish has no room to grow.

There are several points of commonality between the two parishes including: many parishioners already going to each other's Masses, pastors helping each other with confessions and emergency anointing of the sick, St. Vincent de Paul conference includes all of Monroeville, Knights of Columbus has a Monroeville Council, shared summer service trips between the two youth groups and a three year history of both parishes co-sponsoring the New Evangelization for the New Millennium Conference at the Monroeville Convention Center. Finally, both parishes are located in the Gateway School District.

7. What are your concerns/suggestions related to implementation for this group?

If the grouping of the Monroeville/Penn Hills parishes is finalized then our On Mission Team and parishioners would be frustrated, disappointed and angry that the diocese was **not very collaborative** by grouping us with not only St. Bernadette Parish but with the three Penn Hills parishes which not one person asked for in our parish which I verified after I read the line-by-line report of the Catholic Leadership Institute feedback report. Not one person asked for it in any of our six Focus groups which I attended. Furthermore, not one person asked for such a grouping at St. Bernadette Parish (says Fr. Gargotta) and not one person asked for such a grouping in either St. Gerard Majella Parish or St. Suzanna Parish (says Fr. Barkin).

Perhaps the team didn't accurately hear what the people had to say. While we are receptive to the ideas of "phasing" and "more campuses", this seems to be an effort that only hints at collaboration. If the team had really listened to the parishioners of these four parishes, then this grouping would have never been conceived. The natural, logical grouping of the Penn Hills parishes is with their neighboring parishes of St. Joseph, Verona and St. Irenaeus, Oakmont.

8. Please note top themes of feedback from parishioners related to this parish grouping:

Most parishioners feel that the bishop is using a **business** model rather than a **pastoral** model in this proposed grouping and are concerned that the bishop may want to sell our 25 acres of prime real estate. I remember the bishop asking us clergy to rank the four categories of the 21 Criteria according to importance. Our rankings were: Pastoral Care (41 %), Clergy Distribution (25%), Mission Territory (23%) and Financial Viability (12%). In the spirit of collaboration, we think it is better to prioritize the Pastoral Model above the Business Model. As pastor, I remain cautiously optimistic that the bishop and his team will hear our appeal and group North American Martyrs Parish with St. Bernadette Parish which makes the most sense from a geographic, relational and socio-economic point of view to best serve the needs of the Catholic community of Monroeville.

**FOOD BANK**

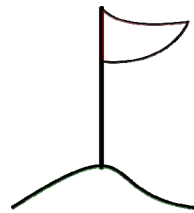

## NEIGHBORHOOD 4, ST. JEAN DE BREBEUF

St. John de Brebeuf was one of the first Jesuit missionaries to reach Canada. He was a hardy frontiersman and established the first mission in 1625 near Lake Ontario. He was the first of the martyrs to be killed while preaching Christianity. In 1649, the Iroquois captured the Huron village of Saint Ignatius and he was killed. His courage was admired by the young native Americans.

## NEIGHBORHOOD 5, ST. CHARLES GARNIER

St. Charles Garnier arrived in Canada in 1636. He, like the other martyrs, preached the faith to the Native Americans. He did much of his work in the Ossernenon village. In 1649, while working with a group of followers, he was killed by the Iroquois.

## NEIGHBORHOOD 6, ST. GABRIEL LALEMANT

St. Gabriel Lalemant arrived in 1648 at Fort St. Mary in Canada. In 1649 he joined Fr. Brebeuf at St. Ignatius. They worked at the mission there attempting to convert the Native Americans to Christianity. The mission was captured by the Iroquois tribe and he was taken prisoner and killed.

## NEIGHBORHOOD 7, ST. ANTOINE DANIEL

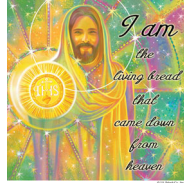
St. Antoine Daniel came to see and stay in Canada in 1632. He preached Christianity to the Native Americans and started the school of our Lady of Angels in Quebec for Native American boys. Many of the Native Americans disliked the idea of their young boys being taught Christianity and the idea of a peaceful existence. One day in 1648 while he was saying Mass in his frontier chapel he was killed.

## NEIGHBORHOOD 8, ST. NOEL CHABANEL

St. Noel Chabanel came to Canada in 1643. He worked for 6 years among the Algonquin near Fort St. Mary. He disliked the cruel customs and tried to teach and show the Native Americans the Christian way. In 1649, he was killed out of hatred for the faith he was teaching to the Huron Indians.
