***NOMINEES FOR LAY ADVISORY BOARD:*** In last week's Pastor's Page I listed the names of the six priests elected by fellow priests to be members of the Pittsburgh East School Merger Board. I had posted that there were five spots available for nominees from pastors in the Pittsburgh East region to qualified lay people who possessed skills in any of the following areas including: Education, Finance, Marketing and Advancement. The nominees cannot be from parishes already represented by priests on the board. **Neither Fr. Tony Gargotta nor I** were elected to the board so hopefully we will each have at least one nominee from our parish on the board. The stipulations from the diocese are that the nominee cannot be a parish employee nor can they currently have a child in a Catholic Elementary School.

I am happy to announce that we have eight candidates who have expressed interest in being a nominee from our parish. They are: **Robert and Mary Jane Petrilli, Frank and Susan Farina, Tony Nicollazo, Trish O'Donnell, Cindy Pascoe and Tom Clark.** I have sent their names, bios and contact information to **Fr. Larry DiNardo, General Secretary**, on Wednesday, July 26, 2017 to meet the deadline. I would be happy with any one of these candidates to be the nominee from our parish since they have all been passionate about North American Martyrs School and present skill sets and experience in Education, Finance, Marketing and Advancement. **There is no guarantee that any of these nominees will be accepted since there are more schools wishing to be represented than there are spots available. Remember that the Pittsburgh East Region includes all the parishes this side of the Squirrel Hill tunnels including areas such as: Bloomfield, Greenfield, Morningside, White Oak, Port Vue, Verona, Point Breeze and Monroeville, Turtle Creek, Penn Hills and Braddock all of which are not yet represented on the board. Pray that God's will be done.**

***NEW MONSIGNOR:*** In a letter to all priests and deacons by **Bishop Zubik** on July 26, the bishop said "It is obvious that your service of the Church is done with great humility and simplicity. We do not answer the call of God to holy orders in order to receive some earthly reward, but trust, instead, that our treasure is in heaven. Still, it is good to give credit where credit is due. As you know, for many years the Diocese of Pittsburgh has not sought to promote priests for the honor of Monsignor. Recently, however, I felt that there was a particular individual who deserved this honor as a result of his humble and dedicated service to the Church of Pittsburgh. Therefore, I am pleased to announce that **His Holiness, Pope Francis**, has accepted my request to promote **Father Ronald Lengwin** to the honor of Chaplain to His Holiness. As you know, **Monsignor Lengwin** has served the Church of Pittsburgh as a priest for over 50 years. Much of his ministry has been focused on faithfully spreading the good news of the Church in communications and in ecumenical and inter-religious dialogue efforts, among other things. Moreover, his devotedness in prayer and his steadfast and compassionate presence in fulfilling his responsibilities and forwarding the mission of the Church make him a shining example to us all. I could think of no better person to be so fittingly recognized.

I will officially invest **Monsignor Lengwin** with this honor during the Mass for the Manifesting the Kingdom Awards on Sunday, September 24, 2017 at St. Paul Cathedral. Please join me in honoring Monsignor Ronald Lengwin and thanking him for his faithful service to God and the Church."

## NEIGHBORHOOD 4, ST. JEAN DE BREBEUF

St. John de Brebeuf was one of the first Jesuit missionaries to reach Canada. He was a hardy frontiersman and established the first mission in 1625 near Lake Ontario. He was the first of the martyrs to be killed while preaching Christianity. In 1649, the Iroquois captured the Huron village of Saint Ignatius and he was killed. His courage was admired by the young native Americans.

## NEIGHBORHOOD 5, ST. CHARLES GARNIER

St. Charles Garnier arrived in Canada in 1636. He, like the other martyrs, preached the faith to the Native Americans. He did much of his work in the Ossernenon village. In 1649, while working with a group of followers, he was killed by the Iroquois.

## NEIGHBORHOOD 6, ST. GABRIEL LALEMANT

St. Gabriel Lalemant arrived in 1648 at Fort St. Mary in Canada. In 1649 he joined Fr. Brebeuf at St. Ignatius. They worked at the mission there attempting to convert the Native Americans to Christianity. The mission was captured by the Iroquois tribe and he was taken prisoner and killed.

## NEIGHBORHOOD 7, ST. ANTOINE DANIEL

St. Antoine Daniel came to see and stay in Canada in 1632. He preached Christianity to the Native Americans and started the school of our Lady of Angels in Quebec for Native American boys. Many of the Native Americans disliked the idea of their young boys being taught Christianity and the idea of a peaceful existence. One day in 1648 while he was saying Mass in his frontier chapel he was killed.

## NEIGHBORHOOD 8, ST. NOEL CHABANEL

St. Noel Chabanel came to Canada in 1643. He worked for 6 years among the Algonquin near Fort St. Mary. He disliked the cruel customs and tried to teach and show the Native Americans the Christian way. In 1649, he was killed out of hatred for the faith he was teaching to the Huron Indians.
