HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION, STILL WAITING, FLEA MARKET RESULTS, COME AND SEE

HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION: Tuesday, August 15, is the **Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary** and a Holy Day of Obligation. The Mass schedule is: Monday, August 14 at 7:00 pm Vigil Mass at NAM Church. Note: while Eucharistic Adoration will take place after the 8:00 am Mass on Monday, August 14, I will have benediction and reposition of the Blessed Sacrament at 6:45 pm just prior to the Vigil Mass. On Tuesday, August 15, the Mass will be at 9:00 am at NAM Church, 12:15 pm at NAM Church and at 7:00 pm at St. Michael Church. I hope to see you at one of the Masses.

STILL WAITING: In my July 30th Pastor's Page, I shared with you the names of eight candidates from our parish whom I submitted to the diocese by the deadline of July 26 for consideration to serve on the Lay Advisory Board to team up with the six priests who are already part of the Pittsburgh East School Merger Board. The prerequisite for the Lay Advisory Board was skill sets and experience in: Education, Finance, Marketing or Advancement. Not only did I submit the names, but I submitted bios for each of the eight candidates.

While waiting to hear from the diocese if any of our candidates have been selected, I received an e-mail on Tuesday that was sent to all of the pastors of schools in the Pittsburgh East Region. The letter said, "The six clergy members elected to the East Regional Catholic Elementary Schools Advisory Board met last Thursday. While we received some very qualified candidates, it became apparent that we did not receive a broad geographical representation of nominees from the east region. There were also instances where names were submitted but little information provided about the nominee (i.e. : the nominee's area (s) of expertise and the reason the individual was nominated).

To better assist the clergy members in their assessment of the nominees, I ask that you kindly click on the link below and complete a short nomination form. Even if you have already submitted nominee names, please submit those names again through this form so that we have consistent information for each nominee. All nomination forms are to be submitted by Wednesday, August 16th."

Even though I'm one of those pastors who submitted complete background information (including education and experience) about each of my eight nominees, I will comply and submit the information again in the new format of the electronic nomination form that diocesan officials request. In the end, I hope that at least one of our nominees is selected to serve on this board.

FLEA MARKET RESULTS: Thanks to **Kevin and Patty Toohill** and the numerous volunteers who helped to make this year's Flea Market a huge success. After expenses, this year's total profit from the Flea Market was \$16,580.00. This topped last year's total of \$14,000. All the proceeds from the Flea Market benefit North American Martyrs School.

We hope to have the Summer Festival Report in next week's bulletin.

NEIGHBORHOOD 4, ST. JEAN DE BREBEUF

St. John de Brebeuf was one of the first Jesuit missionaries to reach Canada. He was a hardy frontiersman and established the first mission in 1625 near Lake Ontario. He was the first of the martyrs to be killed while preaching Christianity. In 1649, the Iroquois captured the Huron village of Saint Ignatius and he was killed. His courage was admired by the young native Americans.

NEIGHBORHOOD 5, ST. CHARLES GARNIER

St. Charles Garnier arrived in Canada in 1636. He, like the other martyrs, preached the faith to the Native Americans. He did much of his work in the Ossernenon village. In 1649, while working with a group of followers, he was killed by the Iroquois.

NEIGHBORHOOD 6, ST. GABRIEL LALEMANT

St. Gabriel Lalemant arrived in 1648 at Fort St. Mary in Canada. In 1649 he joined Fr. Brebeuf at St. Ignatius. They worked at the mission there attempting to convert the Native Americans to Christianity. The mission was captured by the Iroquois tribe and he was taken prisoner and killed.

NEIGHBORHOOD 7, ST. ANTOINE DANIEL

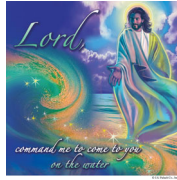
St. Antoine Daniel came to see and stay in Canada in 1632. He preached Christianity to the Native Americans and started the school of our Lady of Angels in Quebec for Native American boys. Many of the Native Americans disliked the idea of their young boys being taught Christianity and the idea of a peaceful existence. One day in 1648 while he was saying Mass in his frontier chapel he was killed.

NEIGHBORHOOD 8, ST. NOEL CHABANEL

St. Noel Chabanel came to Canada in 1643. He worked for 6 years among the Algonquin near Fort St. Mary. He disliked the cruel customs and tried to teach and show the Native Americans the Christian way. In 1649, he was killed out of hatred for the faith he was teaching to the Huron Indians.
