CHRIST THE KING: I will be exposing the Blessed Sacrament after the 11:00 Mass on Sunday, November 26 so that we may adore Christ our King. The church will remain open all afternoon and I will conduct a holy hour beginning at 4:00 pm with Benediction at 4:50 pm. Come and worship Christ the King with us!

PARISH FESTIVAL: On Sunday, November 5, I held a Parish Festival meeting at DeLuca Hall with our past Festival Chairpersons and Committee heads. We had a very honest discussion of what it would take to put on the Festival for this year. The good news is that we have volunteers who are willing to take on the role of Volunteer Coordinator and Games/Prizes Coordinator since **Frank & Susan Farina** will not be able to help us this year as Volunteer Coordinator and Games/Prizes Coordinator. The bad news is that we do not have a new Festival Chairperson (for **Nick Oto** who is not returning) and nor do we have Food Coordinators (for **Lynn Marie** and **Joan O'Toole** who will not be returning). There is no way that I can agree to planning a four-day parish festival for July of 2018 without the commitment of a new festival chairperson and two people who are willing to be the captains for our Food Committee. **If anyone is willing to step up and volunteer to serve the parish in these leadership positions, you must call me by Monday, November 27. It would be important for you to know all that these duties require before agreeing to serve in either one of these capacities which we can talk about.** I would love to see our parish continue this fine tradition of the last six years by having our Seventh Annual Parish Festival. After all, it may be the last one that we have as North American Martyrs Parish since our parish will be grouped with other parishes to form a new parish on October 15, 2018. On the other hand, if I don't hear from anyone willing to take on these leadership roles, then I have the backing of the Festival Committee and my parish staff to choose an alternative celebration for this year, which may only be a one-day event. Please pray about this and get back to me by November 27 if you're interested. By the way, I can't thank enough: **Frank & Susan Farina, Nick Oto, Lynn Marie and Joan O'Toole** for their valuable and dedicated service over the course of (six years – Farina's, six years- Lynn Marie and Joan O'Toole and three years – Nick Oto). We honestly couldn't have had a successful festival without you. You should be very proud of your service!

NEIGHBORHOOD 4, ST. JEAN DE BREBEUF

St. John de Brebeuf was one of the first Jesuit missionaries to reach Canada. He was a hardy frontiersman and established the first mission in 1625 near Lake Ontario. He was the first of the martyrs to be killed while preaching Christianity. In 1649, the Iroquois captured the Huron village of Saint Ignatius and he was killed. His courage was admired by the young native Americans.

NEIGHBORHOOD 5, ST. CHARLES GARNIER

St. Charles Garnier arrived in Canada in 1636. He, like the other martyrs, preached the faith to the Native Americans. He did much of his work in the Ossernenon village. In 1649, while working with a group of followers, he was killed by the Iroquois.

NEIGHBORHOOD 6, ST. GABRIEL LALEMANT

St. Gabriel Lalemant arrived in 1648 at Fort St. Mary in Canada. In 1649 he joined Fr. Brebeuf at St. Ignatius. They worked at the mission there attempting to convert the Native Americans to Christianity. The mission was captured by the Iroquois tribe and he was taken prisoner and killed.

NEIGHBORHOOD 7, ST. ANTOINE DANIEL

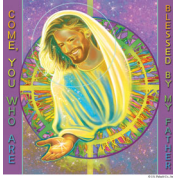
St. Antoine Daniel came to see and stay in Canada in 1632. He preached Christianity to the Native Americans and started the school of our Lady of Angels in Quebec for Native American boys. Many of the Native Americans disliked the idea of their young boys being taught Christianity and the idea of a peaceful existence. One day in 1648 while he was saying Mass in his frontier chapel he was killed.

NEIGHBORHOOD 8, ST. NOEL CHABANEL

St. Noel Chabanel came to Canada in 1643. He worked for 6 years among the Algonquin near Fort St. Mary. He disliked the cruel customs and tried to teach and show the Native Americans the Christian way. In 1649, he was killed out of hatred for the faith he was teaching to the Huron Indians.
