JOY: Hope deferred makes the heart grow sick, but a wish fulfilled is a tree of life.” (Prov. 13:12) My friends, if you want to bring joy to someone, don’t delay in fulfilling your promise to them to visit them, to call them, to take them shopping, to cook for them, to drive them somewhere, to complete a chore or a task. You know how sad a dog is when you leave him/her for a long time. When you keep a person waiting for a long time after you have made them a promise, it makes them sad. Rather, fulfill your promise promptly to bring them joy and happiness!

DOUBLE-HEADERS: This is one of those years when the Fourth Sunday of Advent and Christmas fall on back to back days with the Christmas Eve Masses on the same afternoon and evening of the Fourth Sunday of Advent! It is confusing but that’s just the way the calendar falls this year. You will need to go to church **both** on the Fourth Sunday of Advent and on Christmas. Similarly, the same thing happens on the following week. You will need to go to church on the Feast of the Holy Family as well as on the following day for the Feast of Mary the Mother of God. Yes, the Vigil Masses for Mary, the Mother of God falls on the afternoon of the Feast of the Holy Family. Watch the Mass schedule in the bulletin for further details.

NEIGHBORHOOD 4, ST. JEAN DE BREBEUF

St. John de Brebeuf was one of the first Jesuit missionaries to reach Canada. He was a hardy frontiersman and established the first mission in 1625 near Lake Ontario. He was the first of the martyrs to be killed while preaching Christianity. In 1649, the Iroquois captured the Huron village of Saint Ignatius and he was killed. His courage was admired by the young native Americans.



NEIGHBORHOOD 5, ST. CHARLES GARNIER

St. Charles Garnier arrived in Canada in 1636. He, like the other martyrs, preached the faith to the Native Americans. He did much of his work in the Ossernenon village. In 1649, while working with a group of followers, he was killed by the Iroquois.

NEIGHBORHOOD 6, ST. GABRIEL LALEMANT

St. Gabriel Lalemant arrived in 1648 at Fort St. Mary in Canada. In 1649 he joined Fr. Brebeuf at St. Ignatius. They worked at the mission there attempting to convert the Native Americans to Christianity. The mission was captured by the Iroquois tribe and he was taken prisoner and killed.

NEIGHBORHOOD 7, ST. ANTOINE DANIEL

St. Antoine Daniel came to see and stay in Canada in 1632. He preached Christianity to the Native Americans and started the school of our Lady of Angels in Quebec for Native American boys. Many of the Native Americans disliked the idea of their young boys being taught Christianity and the idea of a peaceful existence. One day in 1648 while he was saying Mass in his frontier chapel he was killed.

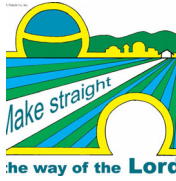


NEIGHBORHOOD 8, ST. NOEL CHABANEL

St. Noel Chabanel came to Canada in 1643. He worked for 6 years among the Algonquin near Fort St. Mary. He disliked the cruel customs and tried to teach and show the Native Americans the Christian way. In 1649, he was killed out of hatred for the faith he was teaching to the Huron Indians.
