Joint Parish Statement for January 21, 2018

Since 2015, the Diocese of Pittsburgh has been engaged in an extensively collaborative process to insure “vibrant parishes” and “effective ministries” as part of On Mission for the Church Alive! On April 26, 2018 Bishop Zubik will officially announce the Parish Groupings and Clergy Staffing. The changes will take effect on October 15, 2018.

As part of this broad collaborative effort which already includes priests, parishes, the On Mission Commission, the Priest Council, and the Diocesan Pastoral Council, there has been an ongoing examination and review of the recommended parish groupings. Keep in mind that no decisions have been made as this is still the consultation phase of the process. These proposed groupings are simply recommendations and possibilities.

It is the desire of the bishop to be transparent about the possible groupings that have surfaced in addition to what was announced to date. You know those that were published as a result of the work of the commission, but not the other possibilities that surfaced as a result of the continued consultation with the Priest Council and the Diocesan Pastoral Council.

For our region, it has been suggested that the bishop consider: 1) a grouping that combines the parishes of the Gateway and Penn Hills school districts: St. Bernadette, North American Martyrs, St. Bartholomew, St. Gerard Majella, and St. Susanna; and 2) a grouping that combines the parishes of the Plum and Riverview school districts: St. Januarius, St. John the Baptist, Our Lady of Joy, St. Irenaeus, and St. Joseph. These groupings were originally included among the first draft models, and appeared again when the bishop listened as consultation continued.

Because the impact is for the entire Diocese of Pittsburgh and not simply one parish, it is a delicate dance to find the best fit for the parish groupings. Given the goals of *On Mission* and the need for a pastoral sensitivity and vision that provides care in every part of the six counties, it remains a work in progress.

Recently the pastors of these aforementioned parishes met together with diocesan officials to discuss the newly proposed models. They are currently meeting with their On Mission Teams to review these proposed amendments which, again, are just possibilities. As a matter of the transparency the bishop desires, we have prepared this unified update which is being published in all of our bulletins this weekend.

All of us pastors are committed to keeping you informed about this process as it relates to our respective parishes. Please pray for Bishop Zubik and all those associated with this widely extensive and prayer filled consultation process. May we all work together “to learn Jesus, love Jesus and live Jesus.”

NEIGHBORHOOD 4, ST. JEAN DE BREBEUF

St. John de Brebeuf was one of the first Jesuit missionaries to reach Canada. He was a hardy frontiersman and established the first mission in 1625 near Lake Ontario. He was the first of the martyrs to be killed while preaching Christianity. In 1649, the Iroquois captured the Huron village of Saint Ignatius and he was killed. His courage was admired by the young native Americans.

NEIGHBORHOOD 5, ST. CHARLES GARNIER

St. Charles Garnier arrived in Canada in 1636. He, like the other martyrs, preached the faith to the Native Americans. He did much of his work in the Ossernenon village. In 1649, while working with a group of followers, he was killed by the Iroquois.

NEIGHBORHOOD 6, ST. GABRIEL LALEMANT

St. Gabriel Lalemant arrived in 1648 at Fort St. Mary in Canada. In 1649 he joined Fr. Brebeuf at St. Ignatius. They worked at the mission there attempting to convert the Native Americans to Christianity. The mission was captured by the Iroquois tribe and he was taken prisoner and killed.

NEIGHBORHOOD 7, ST. ANTOINE DANIEL

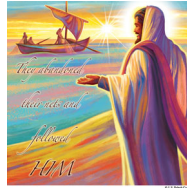
St. Antoine Daniel came to see and stay in Canada in 1632. He preached Christianity to the Native Americans and started the school of our Lady of Angels in Quebec for Native American boys. Many of the Native Americans disliked the idea of their young boys being taught Christianity and the idea of a peaceful existence. One day in 1648 while he was saying Mass in his frontier chapel he was killed.

NEIGHBORHOOD 8, ST. NOEL CHABANEL

St. Noel Chabanel came to Canada in 1643. He worked for 6 years among the Algonquin near Fort St. Mary. He disliked the cruel customs and tried to teach and show the Native Americans the Christian way. In 1649, he was killed out of hatred for the faith he was teaching to the Huron Indians.

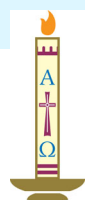
