NEIGHBORHOOD 1, ST. ISAAC JOGUES

Today, we celebrate the third Sunday of Lent. Try to be like Jesus who had compassion to perform miracles to those in need. His crucifixion, burial, and resurrection are the most convincing signs for those who believe. If His body had been stolen, surely one of the guards would have seen who did it. Yet, none of His disciples were ever pursued for grave robbing. Instead, they were only pursued for testifying to His resurrection. In our own life we must be honest and ask the question: Are there areas of my life that I am holding back because I need a sign from God? Do not be afraid to open your hearts to Christ. Allow Him to come into your lives, into your families, into society. In this way, all things will be made new.

NEIGHBORHOOD 2, ST. RENE GOUPIL

The story of the encounter of Jesus with the Samaritan woman at the well has been pondered and retold by theologians and scholars for centuries. Augustine, for instance, uses the example of the woman at the well to describe the spiritual thirst the human heart has for goodness and truth, and that thirst is never quenched until people are in the presence of God forever (after they die and leave this earth). St. John, in this Gospel, concludes the story by saying her witness brought many Samaritans to believe in Jesus, and many more believed because of Jesus' own words. The Samaritans among Jesus' followers reversed widespread expectations. Jesus is "savior of the world," even of the idolatrous Samaritans.

NEIGHBORHOOD 3, ST. JEAN DE LALANDE

NEIGHBORHOOD 4, ST. JEAN DE BREBEUF

St. John de Brebeuf was one of the first Jesuit missionaries to reach Canada. He was a hardy frontiersman and established the first mission in 1625 near Lake Ontario. He was the first of the martyrs to be killed while preaching Christianity. In 1649, the Iroquois captured the Huron village of Saint Ignatius and he was killed. His courage was admired by the young native Americans.

NEIGHBORHOOD 5, ST. CHARLES GARNIER

St. Charles Garnier arrived in Canada in 1636. He, like the other martyrs, preached the faith to the Native Americans. He did much of his work in the Ossernenon village. In 1649, while working with a group of followers, he was killed by the Iroquois.

NEIGHBORHOOD 6, ST. GABRIEL LALEMANT

St. Gabriel Lalemant arrived in 1648 at Fort St. Mary in Canada. In 1649 he joined Fr. Brebeuf at St. Ignatius. They worked at the mission there attempting to convert the Native Americans to Christianity. The mission was captured by the Iroquois tribe and he was taken prisoner and killed.

NEIGHBORHOOD 7, ST. ANTOINE DANIEL

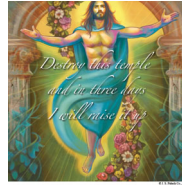
St. Antoine Daniel came to see and stay in Canada in 1632. He preached Christianity to the Native Americans and started the school of our Lady of Angels in Quebec for Native American boys. Many of the Native Americans disliked the idea of their young boys being taught Christianity and the idea of a peaceful existence. He was killed one day in 1648 while he was saying Mass in his frontier chapel.

NEIGHBORHOOD 8, ST. NOEL CHABANEL

St. Noel Chabanel came to Canada in 1643. He worked for 6 years among the Algonquin near Fort St. Mary. He disliked the cruel customs and tried to teach and show the Native Americans the Christian way. In 1649, he was killed out of hatred for the faith he was teaching to the Huron Indians.

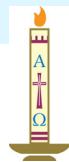
