Report: There Are More Than 215 Million Persecuted Christians Worldwide



There are more than 215 million persecuted Christians worldwide, according to the 2018 "World Watch List," Open Doors USA's annual ranking of the 50 worst countries for violence and persecution against Christians. The report found that one in 12 Christians worldwide are victims of violent persecution. Open Doors USA cites the spread of radical Islam and increasing religious nationalism as the two major drivers of global Christian persecution. North Korea tops the list of worst offenders, as it has for the past 16 years. Although the communist North Korean government claims to provide freedom of religion in its constitution, no one can be openly Christian within the atheist state without facing arrest, re-education in a labor camp, or, in some cases, execution. Afghanistan comes in a close second, Pakistan third. Also included on the list were Mexico and Colombia, where organized crime and corruption were cited as the source of Christian persecution. FEMA GRANTS DISASTER RELIEF TO CHURCHES



When storms ripped through Texas and Florida last fall, churches were some of the hardest hit. Desperate to get back on their feet to help their communities, pastors reached out to FEMA for aid. Like other Americans who lost their businesses and homes, they assumed Washington would help them rebuild. They were wrong. Despite President Donald Trump's very public campaign to protect religious liberty, FEMA dragged its feet. Long enough, it turns out, for the houses of worship to sue. With the help of the Becket Fund, the congregations took the government to court for the right to enjoy the same disaster relief. After four months of slogging through the repairs on their own, the plaintiffs got word last week that FEMA's policy had finally caught up with the White House's direction. In a new document, the agency explains, "In light of the Trinity Lutheran decision [at the Supreme Court], FEMA has considered its guidance on private nonprofit facility eligibility and determined that it will revise its interpretation of the aforementioned statutory and regulatory authorities so as not to exclude houses of worship from eligibility for FEMA aid on the basis of the religious character or primarily religious use of the facility." Senate Vote on 20-Week Abortion Ban Fails

The bill will continue to be considered in the Senate and is widely expected to be a topic of debate in 2018 Senate elections.

The United States is one of seven countries in the world that allow abortions after five months of pregnancy.

The Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act proposes that abortion be made illegal after 20 weeks of gestation, on the basis that fetal neural development enables the unborn to experience pain at that point. The bill includes exceptions for an abortion in the case of rape or incest, as well in the circumstances in which the pregnancy threatened the life or the mother.

Planned Parenthood CEO Cecile Richards Resigns After Presiding Over 3.5 Million Abortions

Planned Parenthood CEO Cecile Richards plans to resign from her position after overseeing more than 3 million unborn babies' abortion deaths, liberal news outlets reported January 24. The CEO since 2006, Richards drew in a huge salary by leading the "non-profit." CDC Report Shows Reductions in Teen Sexual Activity

The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) released a report showing a significant decline in teen sexual activity between 2005 and 2015. The report obtained data on the sexual conduct of teens by analyzing 29 separate state-level Youth Risk Behavior Surveys. Overall, the percentage of teenagers that reported ever having engaged in sexual intercourse declined from 46.8 percent to 41.2 percent over this ten-year time period. Abortion Clinic Targets Black Women With Billboards Saying "Abortion is Necessary"

An abortion clinic in Cleveland, Ohio is specifically targeting black women in a new billboard campaign. The Preterm Abortion Clinic is pushing a billboard campaign only in majority-black neighborhoods, lending additional credence to the notion that abortion clinics specifically focus on selling abortions to black women and aborting black babies.

Studies have shown that abortion clinics are predominantly located in minority neighborhoods, specifically targeting Black and Hispanic neighborhoods. Now the news that a Cleveland, Ohio abortion clinic is only trying to sell abortions to black women adds to those previous studies. None of the billboards explain what an abortion actually is: the killing of a unique, living human being in the womb. Abortions hurt every race and culture, but black Americans have a disproportionately high number of abortions compared to other racial groups. "Shadow Banning" - How Twitter Secretly Censors Conservatives Without Them Even Knowing It

Conservatives and Christians have long suspected that Twitter works aggressively behind the scenes to censor their material. That suspicion has now been confirmed in an undercover investigation involving numerous Twitter employees who let slip what really happens behind the scenes of the mega social media platform.

A Project Veritas (PV) report released January 12, 2018 zeroes in on Twitter's little known practice of "shadow banning," which turns out to be a rather surreptitious stealth method of censorship. "Shadow banning" is a way of blocking users from a social media platform without notifying them. Tweets from a shadow-banned user still appear to their followers, but don't show up in search results, or anywhere else on Twitter.
