Prayer of Surrender

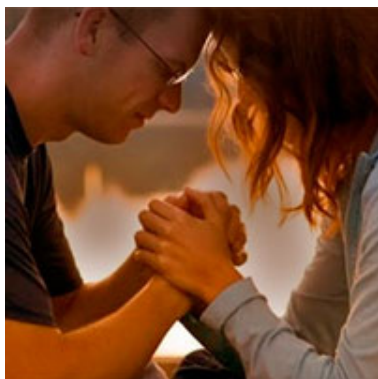
Loving Father,

I surrender to you today with all my heart and soul. Please come into my heart in a deeper way. I say, "Yes" to you today. I open all the secret places of my heart to you and say, "Come on in." Jesus, you are the Lord of my whole life. I believe in you and receive you as my Lord and Savior. I hold nothing back.

Holy Spirit, bring me to a deeper conversion to the person of Jesus Christ. I surrender all to you: my time, my treasures, my talents, my health, my family, my resources, my work, relationships, time management, successes and failures. I release it and let it go.

I surrender my understanding of how things 'ought' to be, my choices and my will. I surrender to you the promises I have kept and the promises I have failed to keep. I surrender my weaknesses and strengths to you. I surrender my emotions, my fears, my insecurities, my sexuality. I especially surrender _____ (Here mention other areas of surrender as the Holy Spirit reveals them to you.)

Lord, I surrender my whole life to you, the past, the present, and the future. In sickness and in health, in life and in death, I belong to you. (Remain the Lord in a spirit of silence through your thoughts, a heart song, or simply staying in His presence and listening for His voice.)



Healing Prayer of Surrender

God, grant me SERENITY to accept the things I cannot change, COURAGE to change the things I can, and WISDOM to know the difference. PARISH SHARE PROGRAM

The Parish Share assessment for our parish this past year was \$90,193. For those who made your pledge, thank you for your generosity. Some people did not make their pledge for which reason we were short \$9,968.75. This year's Parish Share Goal is \$10,297 lower than last year at \$79,896. Since we were almost \$10,000 short of meeting last year's pledge, which is carried over to this year, I am keeping the pledge amount the same. Remember that while The Church Alive Campaign was to help to fulfill the **extraordinary needs** of the diocese (those things we could only dream about), the Parish Share Program helps to fulfill the **ordinary needs** of the diocese, (those things that the diocese has come to depend upon). I am asking that each family consider donating at least \$260.00 to this year's campaign. This is the same amount that I asked each family to donate last year. If everyone does their part we will reach our goal. If for some reason you have fallen upon hard times, any gift will be appreciated. Perhaps those who have been blessed financially will choose to pledge more! You may elect to make your payment in one lump sum of \$260.00 or in ten monthly installments of \$26.00 each. Payment can be made by dropping the pledge card and gift in the collection basket or by sending it through the mail. May the Lord bless you for your generosity.

NEIGHBORHOOD 1, ST. ISAAC JOGUES

Think of the Twenty-third Psalm: "The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want ... and I shall dwell in the house of the Lord forever." Though we probably memorized this psalm, we have to think about what it means to have Jesus as our shepherd. Jesus describes himself as the Good Shepherd which is in contrast to the evil shepherd. The evil shepherd takes his responsibility for the sheep lightly, and puts his own interests ahead of the sheep's well-being, whereas Jesus takes this responsibility as shepherd very seriously, even to the point of dying to save the sheep. The sheep respond differently to the Good Shepherd than they do to the person that takes care of them. Some of us have been born into a Christian home and have grown up with a relationship with Jesus based on the faith of our parents. Our faith becomes alive as we follow the Good Shepherd and respond to his leading in loving obedience. Only then does the Twenty-third Psalm become a reality for us.

NEIGHBORHOOD 2, ST. RENE GOUPIL

The first word in today's second reading is an imperative: "See". Seeing means more than beholding with the eyes, it includes spiritual insight and discernment, too. In exhorting his audience to see, John is telling them that they should be attentive to the reality of God's love that they themselves have experienced. God's love, already revealed through creation and history, took on human flesh in Jesus, God's own Son. The believers have seen and known God's love in Christ. Through Him and in Him, God has bestowed love so that believers can be called children of God. God's love in Christ is thus life-giving and transformative. It brings about a new creation in the believers themselves.

NEIGHBORHOOD 4, ST. JEAN DE BREBEUF

St. John de Brebeuf was one of the first Jesuit missionaries to reach Canada. He was a hardy frontiersman and established the first mission in 1625 near Lake Ontario. He was the first of the martyrs to be killed while preaching Christianity. In 1649, the Iroquois captured the Huron village of Saint Ignatius and he was killed. His courage was admired by the young native Americans.

NEIGHBORHOOD 5, ST. CHARLES GARNIER

St. Charles Garnier arrived in Canada in 1636. He, like the other martyrs, preached the faith to the Native Americans. He did much of his work in the Ossernenon village. In 1649, while working with a group of followers, he was killed by the Iroquois.

NEIGHBORHOOD 6, ST. GABRIEL LALEMANT

St. Gabriel Lalemant arrived in 1648 at Fort St. Mary in Canada. In 1649 he joined Fr. Brebeuf at St. Ignatius. They worked at the mission there attempting to convert the Native Americans to Christianity. The mission was captured by the Iroquois tribe and he was taken prisoner and killed.

NEIGHBORHOOD 7, ST. ANTOINE DANIEL

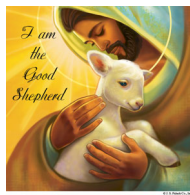
St. Antoine Daniel came to see and stay in Canada in 1632. He preached Christianity to the Native Americans and started the school of our Lady of Angels in Quebec for Native American boys. Many of the Native Americans disliked the idea of their young boys being taught Christianity and the idea of a peaceful existence. He was killed one day in 1648 while he was saying Mass in his frontier chapel.

NEIGHBORHOOD 8, ST. NOEL CHABANEL

St. Noel Chabanel came to Canada in 1643. He worked for 6 years among the Algonquin near Fort St. Mary. He disliked the cruel customs and tried to teach and show the Native Americans the Christian way. In 1649, he was killed out of hatred for the faith he was teaching to the Huron Indians.
