THOUGHTS ON THE LAST SCHOOL MASS**



**CORPUS CHRISTI ADORATION:** On the solemnity of Corpus Christi, June 3, I will expose the Blessed Sacrament after the 11:00 Mass so that the parish can adore the Eucharist all afternoon. There will be a Holy Hour at 4:00 pm led by **Joe Michalak** followed by Benediction at 4:50 pm. All are welcome to spend time adoring the Lord and thanking him for His many blessings.

**DYNAMIC SPEAKER:** A nationally known Catholic speaker and best-selling author, **Jon Leonetti**, will be delivering a Parish Mission at Corpus Christi Church, 2515 Versailles Avenue, McKeesport on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday, June, 4, 5 and 6 at 7:00 pm. His theme is “Surge of the Heart”. Matthew Kelly, the founder of Dynamic Catholic said that Jon Leonetti is “one of the most inspiring parish missions available in America today.” All are welcome!

**ST. ANTHONY ITALIAN MASS:** I am happy to announce that this year, **Fr. Brian Noel**, will be the guest celebrant for the annual Italian Mass at St. Michael Church on Wednesday, June 13 at 7:00 pm. The Mass will be celebrated in Italian except for the homily which will be in English. The worship aid given to all who come will have the parallel translations of both the Italian and English for the readings. Fr. Brian is the Spiritual Director for St. Paul Seminary, Crafton. He will be bringing with him several seminarians to join us in our celebration.

Part of the celebration is processing with the statue of St. Anthony for about a ¼ mile down Wall Avenue to the parking lot of the Pitcairn Assembly of God where we will turn around and come back. **Mirella Volpe** will be singing and playing the accordion for our procession and for the **Festa** that will follow at St. Michael Hall in which we will have a variety of Italian food brought by many faithful volunteers. We hope you can join us.

**THOUGHTS ON THE LAST SCHOOL MASS:** It’s never easy ending a long-lasting tradition such as celebrating the last school Mass at North American Martyrs Church. The first day of official school classes was September 1, 1964. The first school Mass would have been celebrated shortly thereafter by the founding pastor, Fr. John H. McMahon. I have the dubious distinction of celebrating the last school Mass on June 1, 2018. That’s a 54 year history! While our school had not been in existence as long as some other schools in the diocese, it’s still more than have a century of educating our boys and girls to be young men and women, witnesses of the faith, prepared for high school.

Think of 54 graduating classes. . . Of course, for most of those years, our school only went up to the 6<sup>th</sup> grade. Even still, if that student started in pre-school, then they would have spent nine years with us considering two years of pre-school, kindergarten and grades one through six. Think of all the basketball games and in recent years, soccer games. Think of all the assemblies, the Christmas and Spring Band and Choral Concerts. Think of the years of the Children’s Stations of the Cross, May Crowning and the Children’s Masses. Think of all the principals, the religious and lay teachers who instructed our children, and the school secretaries, cafeteria staff, playground monitors, and volunteers. If we just take stock of the pastors alone, there was Fr. McMahon, followed by Fr. DeLuca (who had the longest tenure of 28 years.) He was followed by Fr. Bud Murhammer, Fr. Tom Lewandowski and then me. Think of all the school fundraisers: the Bingos, the Galas, the Walk-a-thons, the Sarris Candy Bar sales, Santa’s shop, selling poinsettias, Scrip cards, Oktoberfest, Night at the Races, Trivia Night and of course, the Fish Fries. Think of all the friendships that were made not only among the children, but among the parents. Some of these were to become lasting friendships that have stood the test of time.

We can take some consolation in knowing that Catholic education will continue in Monroeville. Our school will become the pre-school for Divine Mercy Academy while K-8 will be instructed at St. Bernadette School. It is sad to be losing our school but we must all adapt to change. Perhaps we can lean on the helpful advice of Pope Paul VI who said: “Let us open ourselves to the Holy Spirit, to remove what is opposed to His action, and to proclaim, in the Christian authenticity of our daily lives, that Jesus is Lord.”

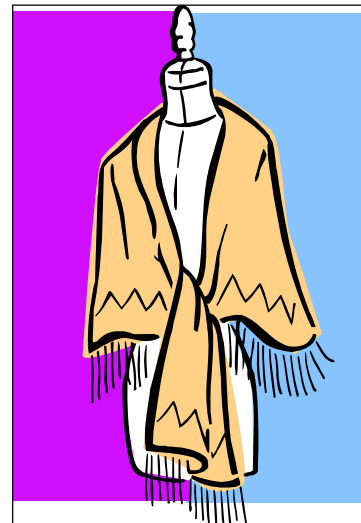

## NEIGHBORHOOD 1, ST. ISAAC JOGUES

## NEIGHBORHOOD 4, ST. JEAN DE BREBEUF

St. John de Brebeuf was one of the first Jesuit missionaries to reach Canada. He was a hardy frontiersman and established the first mission in 1625 near Lake Ontario. He was the first of the martyrs to be killed while preaching Christianity. In 1649, the Iroquois captured the Huron village of Saint Ignatius and he was killed. His courage was admired by the young native Americans.

## NEIGHBORHOOD 5, ST. CHARLES GARNIER

St. Charles Garnier arrived in Canada in 1636. He, like the other martyrs, preached the faith to the Native Americans. He did much of his work in the Ossernenon village. In 1649, while working with a group of followers, he was killed by the Iroquois.

## NEIGHBORHOOD 2, ST. RENE GOUPIL

## NEIGHBORHOOD 6, ST. GABRIEL LALEMANT

St. Gabriel Lalemant arrived in 1648 at Fort St. Mary in Canada. In 1649 he joined Fr. Brebeuf at St. Ignatius. They worked at the mission there attempting to convert the Native Americans to Christianity. The mission was captured by the Iroquois tribe and he was taken prisoner and killed.

## NEIGHBORHOOD 3, ST. JEAN DE LALANDE

## NEIGHBORHOOD 7, ST. ANTOINE DANIEL

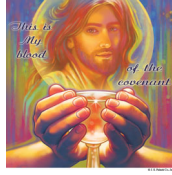
St. Antoine Daniel came to see and stay in Canada in 1632. He preached Christianity to the Native Americans and started the school of our Lady of Angels in Quebec for Native American boys. Many of the Native Americans disliked the idea of their young boys being taught Christianity and the idea of a peaceful existence. He was killed one day in 1648 while he was saying Mass in his frontier chapel.

## NEIGHBORHOOD 8, ST. NOEL CHABANEL

St. Noel Chabanel came to Canada in 1643. He worked for 6 years among the Algonquin near Fort St. Mary. He disliked the cruel customs and tried to teach and show the Native Americans the Christian way. In 1649, he was killed out of hatred for the faith he was teaching to the Huron Indians.
