ST. ANTHONY ITALIAN MASS, "HOLEY WINDOWS", NEW MAINTENANCE GARAGE DOOR, ON MISSION EUCHARISTIC DAY, FESTIVAL RAFFLE TICKETS, HOW 'BOUT A RETREAT?



ST. ANTHONY ITALIAN MASS: I am happy to announce that this year, **Fr. Brian Noel**, will be the guest celebrant for the annual Italian Mass at St. Michael Church on Wednesday, June 13 at 7:00 pm. The Mass will be celebrated in Italian except for the homily which will be in English. The worship aid given to all who come will have the parallel translations of both the Italian and English for the readings. Fr. Brian is the Spiritual Director for St. Paul Seminary, Crafton. He will be bringing with him several seminarians to join us in our celebration.

Part of the celebration is processing with the statue of St. Anthony for about a ¼ mile down Wall Avenue to the parking lot of the Pitcairn Assembly of God where we will turn around and come back. **Mirella Volpe** will be singing and playing the accordion for our procession and for the **Festa** that will follow at St. Michael Hall in which we will have a variety of Italian food brought by many faithful volunteers. We hope you can join us.

"HOLEY WINDOWS": A couple of months ago, I mentioned in my Pastor's Page, that I decided to use some of the reserve money from the sale of St. Michael rectory to replace certain stain glass windows at St. Michael Church. Years ago, before I was assigned pastor at St. Michael Church, someone had used a BB gun to shoot holes in some of the windows at St. Michael Church on the side facing Wall Avenue. This has allowed cold/hot air transfer depending on the season as well as it marring the aesthetic beauty of the stained glass. This past week, Hunt Stained Glass Studio has been replacing the broken panes throughout Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. The windows should be finished for this weekend and for the St. Anthony Italian Mass celebration. That's the good news. The bad news is that we don't have money in the budget to fix certain "bowed windows" nor do we have the money to replace the frames. Even still, any improvement in the windows is welcomed. We do what we can.

NEW MAINTENANCE GARAGE DOOR We had to spend \$1,200.00 from our Capital Improvement Fund to replace the maintenance garage door on the NAM campus near **Ron Kreske's** office. The original garage door was installed in 1962 and the springs finally broke and the door couldn't be lifted. Over the next month the new garage door will be installed. We're hoping it's installed in time for the Festival.

ON MISSION EUCHARISTIC DAY Every parish in the diocese was expected to host a Eucharistic Day between April 2018 and October 2018 in conjunction with the announcement of the new parish groupings and clergy assignments as part of *On Mission for the Church Alive*. Our Eucharistic Day is our normal Eucharistic day which falls on the second Monday of the month which happens to be this Monday, June 11. I will expose the Blessed Sacrament after the 8:00 am Mass at NAM Church and will lead a holy hour from 7:00 pm to 8:00 pm using a Scripture passage that will help us with our transition into a new grouping, new Mass schedule and new clergy assignments. Please join me for the holy hour next Monday as we pray for wisdom, patience, understanding, charity and peace.

NEIGHBORHOOD 1, ST. ISAAC JOGUES

This week's readings may reveal the question that we all have: "Who is this man Jesus?" and "What should we believe regarding Him?". In the first reading, we observe Satan's temptation of Adam and Eve and their dilemma if they should believe God who created all things for their good. Unfortunately, it was at that point that they decided to not believe God, but to believe Satan, and they disobeyed. In the Gospel reading the crowd was in turmoil asking who Jesus was, and where did He get these powers. What are they to believe? To believe is a personal decision. NEIGHBORHOOD 4, ST. JEAN DE BREBEUF

St. John de Brebeuf was one of the first Jesuit missionaries to reach Canada. He was a hardy frontiersman and established the first mission in 1625 near Lake Ontario. He was the first of the martyrs to be killed while preaching Christianity. In 1649, the Iroquois captured the Huron village of Saint Ignatius and he was killed. His courage was admired by the young native Americans.

NEIGHBORHOOD 5, ST. CHARLES GARNIER

St. Charles Garnier arrived in Canada in 1636. He, like the other martyrs, preached the faith to the Native Americans. He did much of his work in the Ossernenon village. In 1649, while working with a group of followers, he was killed by the Iroquois.

NEIGHBORHOOD 6, ST. GABRIEL LALEMANT

St. Gabriel Lalemant arrived in 1648 at Fort St. Mary in Canada. In 1649 he joined Fr. Brebeuf at St. Ignatius. They worked at the mission there attempting to convert the Native Americans to Christianity. The mission was captured by the Iroquois tribe and he was taken prisoner and killed.

NEIGHBORHOOD 7, ST. ANTOINE DANIEL


St. Antoine Daniel came to see and stay in Canada in 1632. He preached Christianity to the Native Americans and started the school of our Lady of Angels in Quebec for Native American boys. Many of the Native Americans disliked the idea of their young boys being taught Christianity and the idea of a peaceful existence. He was killed one day in 1648 while he was saying Mass in his frontier chapel.

NEIGHBORHOOD 8, ST. NOEL CHABANEL

St. Noel Chabanel came to Canada in 1643. He worked for 6 years among the Algonquin near Fort St. Mary. He disliked the cruel customs and tried to teach and show the Native Americans the Christian way. In 1649, he was killed out of hatred for the faith he was teaching to the Huron Indians.
