INTERIM MASS SCHEDULE:

Dear Parishioner:

In a few weeks the implementation phase of the On Mission for the Church Alive begins. All around the diocese, new clergy teams have been preparing by visiting the parishes of their grouping, participating in sessions for formation and information, and talking about a shared vision and their hopes for the future.

This letter announces the interim Mass schedule for our grouping. The new weekday schedule is effective on Monday, October 15, 2018, and the weekend schedule begins with the Vigil Masses on Saturday, October 20, 2018. Please remember that this schedule is interim, which means it will be evaluated and adjusted as necessary, after the clergy team has had sufficient time to celebrate Masses, and determine, with your feedback, how it suits the pastoral needs of all the parishioners in our grouping.

*The interim schedule was developed by **Fr. Al Zapf** with input from the outgoing pastors, clergy teams and regional vicars. The schedule accommodates as best as possible, the number of priests assigned to a grouping, the seating capacity of the churches, parking availability, accessibility, Sunday religious education schedules, and geography and travel time between churches.*

We are embarking on a new endeavor to bring renewed energy around the practice of our faith in the whole diocese. Even as we face changing schedules and new clergy assignments we are called to, as members of the Body of Christ, to promote unity and share our resources for the good of all people. May God continue to guide us always and in all ways.

A NECESSARY MEETING: About 75 people came for the Discussion Session on the Grand Jury Report of Clergy Sexual Abuse in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. The majority of people came from our parish but there were some from St. Bernadette's, St. Colman's and from the Greensburg Diocese. The feedback that I received after the meeting was very positive. While we did not solve any problems, (which wasn't my goal) those who came to the "open mike" were authentic, honest and at times, angry against what appears to be an institutional cover-up in the Diocese of Pittsburgh. While I defended Bishop Zubik and Pope Francis, there were many questions aimed at the lack of judgement of former bishops who transferred pedophile priests from one parish to another and even signed off on sending them to other dioceses without alerting them of the unsuitability of that particular priest.

Just as we started with prayer at the beginning of the meeting, we ended the meeting with prayer with the group standing in a large circle, joining hands as we spontaneously prayed for the needs of the Church. The response of the attendees was that the meeting was helpful and healing, just to talk, listen and pray for the needs of the clergy and laity in our diocese and the Diocese of Greensburg.

NEW SERVER/EM: Please welcome a single young adult, **Jacob Ranelli**, as a newly trained altar server and Eucharistic Minister. Jacob also agreed to serve as a homebound minister to the residents at Woodhaven. Thanks also to **Don Wenstrup** who trained Jacob for both liturgical ministries.

HELP WANTED FOR PARISHIONER IN NEED: Our St. Vincent de Paul President told me of a new parishioner who had a recent hardship when her car was totaled in an accident. She did not have collision insurance. Without an automobile, she risks losing her new job as the only family bread winner. Public transportation is lacking in her neighborhood. The family recently moved to the area and used all its savings in the move. There are also special needs members of the family. If you or someone you know has been thinking about donating a vehicle in reasonable working condition to a charity, perhaps you would consider this case as another option. Please contact the parish office if you can help. Thanks for your kind attention.

Jewish Law and the Gospel both condemn discrimination, exemplified by how the person is addressed and in the preferential seating for the rich. James recalls the Church's predilection for the poor. The Christian community has no room for favoritism based on status or wealth.
