FAREWELL TO BENEDICTINES: I thanked **Prior Earl Henry O.S.B.** for faithfully sending a Benedictine monk to assist me with either the 8:00 am Mass at NAM Church and the 9:30 am Mass at St. Michael Church on alternating weeks throughout most of my nine years here. The only exceptions was when **Fr. Steve Chervenak** (of happy memory) lived with me, or when I had the luxury of having a missionary or visiting priest living with me for a short time. Prior Earl would also send me Benedictine monks whenever I asked him to assist with communal penance services during Advent and Lent. I told Prior Earl that the parish is indebted to the Benedictines who have been there these last nine years when we needed them. Prior Earl said in return that it was a joy for the Benedictine monks to serve our parish and we hoped that our paths would cross again in the future. The last scheduled Mass for a Benedictine monk will be at the 8:00 a.m. Mass on Sunday, October 14. After that, the new team of five priests serving six churches will be rotating to meet the needs of the parishioners in all six churches in this grouping.

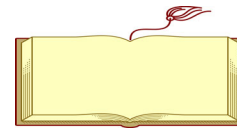

**MASS BOOK TO OPEN**

The Mass Book for 2019 will open on Thursday, **October 18** for both NAM & St. Michael. You may come in person to NAM from 10:00 AM-12:00 Noon and 2:00-4:00 PM. We have lost three Masses per week, which means we have 156 fewer Masses we are able to schedule; however, the good news is that we have 312 Masses for the year that we can schedule. Our suggestion is to combine family members when you can, and limit the number of Masses for any one intention to two. At the present time, we have a small surplus of Masses which would be sent to retired priests or mission priests who are in need of Mass Intentions only if that surplus increased dramatically. Once the Masses taken on October 18 are scheduled, we will begin scheduling the backlog.
