TRUSTING IN GOD'S LOVE: For the last article of my last Pastor's Page, I wanted to share with you an article that appeared in the *Living with Christ* (October issue) for October 7 (last Sunday). The article is entitled "Trusting in God's love" by **Amy Welborn**. I think her message is very relevant and timely for you and me as together we transition through "On Mission for the Church Alive". Here's the article:

In today's gospel reading, Jesus' disciples rebuke those who are trying to bring children to Jesus. But Jesus tells them: "The kingdom of God belongs to such as these. Amen, I say to you, whoever does not accept the kingdom of God like a child will not enter it."

This passage reminds me of once, long ago, when life was getting to me. I tossed my toddler daughter in the car, and we took off for the beach. I didn't even make clear to her where we were going. We just went.

We arrived, and she played, delighted as I sat and pondered. At this time, she had never questioned where we were going, never fought it. She had just come along for the ride, accepting and happy.

I could have seen naivete' in her acceptance, and perhaps that is one way to look at it. But at the time, I simply saw trust: trust in where I was taking her, because she trusted that I loved her and would only want the best for her.

Like God's love for me, can I accept where God takes me? May we trust in God, and welcome God's reign of love in our lives.

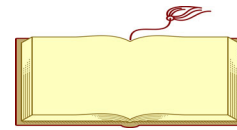
All Things Are Possible for God – This Sunday's Gospel brings us back to the basics. The young man with whom Jesus is conversing strives to live the commandments, yet when

**MASS BOOK TO OPEN**

The Mass Book for 2019 will open on Thursday, **October 18** for both NAM & St. Michael. You may come in person to NAM from 10:00 AM-12:00 Noon and 2:00-4:00 PM. We have lost three Masses per week, which means we have 156 fewer Masses we are able to schedule; however, the good news is that we have 312 Masses for the year that we can schedule. Our suggestion is to combine family members when you can, and limit the number of Masses for any one intention to two. At the present time, we have a small surplus of Masses which would be sent to retired priests or mission priests who are in need of Mass Intentions only if that surplus increased dramatically. Once the Masses taken on October 18 are scheduled, we will begin scheduling the backlog.
